The tone of the Gospel begins to grow darker: Jesus is now on his way to Jerusalem, where he will be arrested and killed. Despite this there is a lighter contrast in the children that Jesus welcomes and blesses. This tells us something about Jesus and his mission: despite the gathering clouds, (and possibly even because of that) he is still the manifestation of God's love for all his children, a love that will be most clearly displayed when he faces death for our sake. In today's first reading there is a chilling phrase which links these together. The plotters against the good man say "Let us test him with cruelty and torture, and thus explore this gentleness of his." This cold calculation is the same as the plotting of those who saw in Jesus a threat to their positions – with all his purity of worship and faith, with all his "reproaches for our breaches of the law". Even though the storm clouds gather, the last line of the first reading, will come true: "God will look after him – we have his word for it." And three days after his death he will rise again.
