

The Season of Lent

Lent, like Advent is a season of preparation. It's austerity motivated by our sorrow for sin is tempered by the joy we experience as people who have been redeemed by the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. Lent puts before us the whole mystery of salvation through which God's merciful love has been revealed in Jesus Christ his Son.

Lent is a time of anticipation and waiting for the coming Easter celebration. The full meaning of Lent is to be found in its consummation in the three days (*Triduum*) of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday.

The rigours of Lent are undergone to prepare us for the triumphant emergence of Christ from the tomb. In Lent we are reminded that we must die to ourselves if we are to rise with Christ. The Gospel message of Lent is clear "if we die with him we shall rise with him."

The various aspects of Lent as a baptismal season are beautifully set out for us in the Gospels for the first and second Sundays of Lent. On the first Sunday, Christ in the desert refuses to seek his happiness in the riches of the world and affirms his trust and submission to the Father. On the second Sunday the transfigured Christ, with Moses and Elijah, is revealed to his apostles as Israel's glory and ours.

Our pilgrimage in the footsteps of the Master calls for constant vigilance, prayer and self denial as he leads us towards our heavenly Jerusalem.

Our whole life is like the season of Lent waiting and preparing until the day when we will be with the Lord in his glory. This is the full meaning of Christian baptism.
