Gift Aid

Gift Aid to krajowy program organizowany przez Inland Revenue (Urzad Skarbowy) i iest prostym sposobem na zwiekszenie wartości darowizn na rzecz kościoła bez dodatkowych kosztów ofiarodawcy. Jeśli płacisz podatek w Wielkiej Brytanii, możemy odzyskać podatek podstawowy (25%) od pieniędzy, które przekazujesz kościołowi. Na przykład, jeśli ofiarujesz 10 funtów, kościół może odzyskać 2,50 funta podatku od rządu. Podatek, który płacisz, musi być równy lub większy niż kwota darowizny odzyskanej w ra-mach darowizn na cele charytatywne w każdym roku podatkowym. Każda parafia zachęca swoich parafian do wypelnienia tej deklaracji i duża część naszych funduszy pochodzi właśnie z tego programu. Wystarczy wypełnić formularz GAD (Gift Aid Declaration). Jest to oświadczenie złożone dla organizacji charytatywną, potwierdzające, że chcesz przekazać darowiznę za pośrednictwem Gift Aid i aby organizacja ta otrzymała zwrot po-datku od Twojej darowizny. Otrzymasz pu-dełko kopert na ofiary i po prostu wkładasz pieniądze na niedzielną 'tacę' do koperty, a nie luzem. Możesz też zdecydować się na płatność za pomocą zleceń bankowych. Jeśli chcesz dowiedzieć się więcej na temat Gift Aid, skontaktuj się z John Lubugumu, organiza-torem Gift Aid w naszej parafii.
