In the Cycle of Sunday Readings, the oldest are those of Year A in Lent. These Gospels have accompanied the Church for many centuries. We must realise why: Lent was originally the time of immediate preparation of candidates for Baptism at Easter (something which has been reintroduced to the Church by RCIA): those already baptised used it as a time to prepare for the renewal of Baptismal promises. This is why so much of the Scripture in Lent is about Baptism, New Life and Salvation. What is the new life of Baptism? What are we set free from? What is sin? We begin Lent by hearing about sin and temptation; the Gospel will tell us of Jesus' own temptations, something he shares with us, though he did not sin. The other Scripture readings prepare us for the Gospel, in which Jesus, the new Adam, triumphs over temptation.

# St Nick's News

The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have designated 2020 as 'The God Who Speaks': A Year of the Word to celebrate the 10th anniversary of Verbum Domini- Pope Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation on 'The Word of the Lord' and the 1600th anniversary of St Jerome's death. Therefore 2020 will be a year of celebrating, living and sharing God's word and we have decided to make World Book Day, a Bible Day, a God Who Speaks day in our school. Our theme is 'Your Word is our Light': 'Your word is a lamp for my steps and a light for my path.' Psalm 119: 1050n Thursday 5 March (World Book Day), the children have been invited to come to school dressed as 'light' (e.g., white, yellow, reflective clothing). Or, if they prefer, they may come to school dressed as their favourite person or animal from the Bible (e.g., the Angel Gabriel, a Wise Man, the donkey that carried Mary, Noah or one of the animals). They are also invited to bring a torch and their own Bible. In the afternoon, Fr Jonathon and Fr Cyriacus will lead a torchlight assembly answering children's questions about the Bible. They will also share their favourite Bible passages with the children and will bless the children's Bibles from home. We look forward to celebrating World Book Day on the 5 March and hope that it will be an extra special day for the children.
