Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God

Everyone on this earth belongs to God. All are made in his image. Therefore it is right that all men and women, 'from the rising to the setting of the sun', should know the God to whom they belong. The only desire of our God is that all should know and love him, and find in him the fulfilment that they seek. Even a pagan king like Cyrus is used to further this knowledge of God - just as Jesus uses Caesar's head to make the point again: all belong to God, and the mission of all who acknowledge that belonging is to help others to find it. This is exactly what we see Paul, Silvanus and Timothy doing, as they write to the people of Thessalonica, to whom they carried the Good News of Jesus Christ.

You must love the Lord your God, and your neighbour as yourself


When you look at something like the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and see its 691 pages, or look at the 2,000 pages of the big Jerusalem Bible, you can be forgiven for thinking that Christianity is a complicated affair. But Jesus reminds us today that it is essentially very simple: everything can be summed up in two basic rules: love God, love your neighbour. Exodus backs this up, by talking about the simple love that we must show to each other. Not that this is easy - love is always costly, and involves some degree of sacrifice. We will have to change, to become perfect in love; but it is possible, and when we do, like the people of Thessalonica, we become a great example to people everywhere.

Indefinite Detention

The Jesuit Refugee Service (J.R.S.) held an event on Zoom recently about the issue of Indefinite Detention, as an accompaniment to their report on the issue, entitled "Detained and Dehumanised". The Event can be watched on-line on J.R.S.'s You Tube Channel. The report can be read on their website. J.R.S. invite us to speak out for those who come to the UK seeking sanctuary, and to help in the following ways:

- **Pray:** It is a real comfort to those detained to know that we are praying for them.
- **Speaking out:** Write to our MPs, asking to support a time limit and judicial, rather than just political, oversight of detention. There is a template for a letter on the J.R.S. website.
- **J.R.S.** are looking for volunteers to visit those in detention in centres in Bedford, Lincoln and Scotland. They are looking for people who have languages such as Arabic, Urdu and Hindi.


Pope Francis on Mercy...


In the present day, as the Church is charged with the task of the new evangelisation, the theme of mercy needs to be proposed again and again with new enthusiasm and renewed pastoral action. It is absolutely essential for the Church and for the credibility of her message that she herself live and testify mercy.

Growing In Faith Together

WHAT IS IT? GIFT is for families of faith; for families with children who are looking forward to receiving Holy Communion; for families with older children who want to be confirmed in their faith; for families with younger children who want to experience and grow in faith in a simple and enjoyable way.

HOW DOES IT WORK? Our first three GIFT sessions at the beginning of this year were a great success with over 30 families joining together at St Nicholas School on Saturday mornings. Due to the current situation and our inability to meet together we are having to do things in a different way. We have invested in resources which are designed to support parents in sharing their faith and helping their families grow in knowledge and love of God, his creation, Jesus his Son and the wonderful gift of the Holy Spirit and his action in the world and our lives. We are offering these resources to any family who may be genuinely interested in and willing to engage in the process. This is not homework for children (!) but a real opportunity for families to share and enjoy their faith at home TOGETHER (which the Church has always described as the Domestic Church).





'God calls' resources by focusing on: introducing you to the structure and format of the resources; exploring the catechesis and faith teaching of the resource and answering any questions you may have. The material concentrates on coaching you to teach and support your children in learning about faith. Following the Zoom call, you will be emailed the resources which can be used with the whole family during the month.

Sky Diving for Hospice

After 7 months in lockdown, Virginia Mcgregor needed some excitement and some fresh air. So she booked to do a 15,000 foot skydive with the funds raised going to the Hospice where she is a volunteer.

To prepare she had done a few stretches etc. that she thought might help and bought a bright jogging suit so people would know it was her and set off for the centre.

The sky was grey but with high spirits she was advised that she would be first out of the plane once it reached 15,000 feet.

Very quickly the plane reached the target height and the doors to the plane were opened wide and Virginia was advised to kneel in the opening and just fall forward into the bright Blue sky. "Believe it or not I did, completely forgetting for a minute that my instructor and the man wearing the parachute was attached. There was absolute silence and for a number of minutes we just went where the breeze took us. It took my breath away and I felt very safe and so close to God. Then the parachute opened and we sailed down to the landing strip. What a way to get some fresh air I can definitely recommend it!"

Face Masks/Coverings

For all the Saints...


18 October St Luke, Evangelist

Luke was a Greek doctor who converted to Christianity. He was a companion of the Apostle Paul, and wrote his Gospel in accordance with Paul's teaching.

He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles, which narrates the early history of the Church up to Paul's first stay in Rome. As a Greek, he takes care to explain to Gentile readers Jewish customs and the meaning of Hebrew words.



22 October St John Paul II (1920-2005) Pope




Karol Józef Wojtyła was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various pastoral and academic tasks. He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Kraków and took part in the Second Vatican Council. On 16 October 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches. In Rome on 2 April 2005, the eve of the Second Sunday of Easter (or of Divine Mercy), he departed peacefully in the Lord. He was canonized by Pope Francis on 27 April, the Second Sunday of Easter 2014.

28 October SS Simon & St Jude Apostles

St Simon is eleventh in the list of the twelve Apostles. He is known as Simon the Zealot, but nothing else is known about him. His other name of "Simon Cananaeus" simply adapts another Hebrew word for "zeal" and has nothing to do with the town of Cana.

St Jude, also called Thaddaeus, is the apostle who at the Last Supper asked the Lord why he showed himself only to the disciples and not to the world. For many centuries he was scarcely venerated because people confused him with Judas Iscariot. He is the patron saint of lost and desperate causes.
