

Blessed Sacrament Parish Heavitree Exeter

8 November 2020 Thirty Second Ordinary time. Remembrance Day. Year A



'Watch early for wisdom': wise words, and ones that the foolish bridesmaids of the Gospel should have taken to heart. This is the ultimate in 'putting off till tomorrow...', since the reading is about the end of time, when the Son of Man will come again. Then there will be no tomorrow. If a thing is worth doing, it's worth doing today. Quite often we contemplate the end of time with anxiety and fear: this is not what God wants. Look at the Psalm, where we hear of desperate longing, a thirst for the Lord, that cannot wait. We should not just wait for the Lord with patient endurance, but with impatient longing: what could we desire more than the coming of the Lord, the rising of the dead and an eternity of joy and glory?

Lockdown 2 What it means for us

The first thing of course is that we cannot celebrate Mass with a congregation for the next month. The bishops of England and Wales as well as other faith leaders in the country lobbied the government hard to enable us to celebrate, especially considering the lengths we have gone to to make the church a safe space, but to no avail. So we are back to individual prayer – at least we can open for that – and I will celbrate Mass regularly in the church on my own (well not on my own as I know you will join me in prayer).

As citizens of the country we follow the rules. Even if we find it challenging at times we will play our part in helping the nation to overcome and recover from the pandemic. Prayer is a powerful force for good, so I would urge to continue to pray at home, especially if you are vulnerable. The Domestic Church has always been at the heart of our understanding of the Church community. At this time, the Church At Home really can come into its own. Why not set up a prayer station at home; a candle, a bible, some flowers and a crucific placed together on a sideboard or a desk can help focus our minds and remind us to always turn to the Lord.

On November 25 we will have the livestreaming equipment installed in the church. In the meantime I will endeavour to live stream a Mass most days on Facebook. I'll let you know the times and days on Facebook. I hope you will be able to join me.

In the meantime keep safe. The virus has not gone away and we need to be vigilant. Pray for me as I continue to pray for you all. God bless you. *Fr Jonathn*.



Growing In Faith Together

WHAT IS IT? GIFT is for families of faith; for families with children who are looking forward to receiving Holy Communion; for families with older children who want to be confirmed in their faith; for families with younger children who want to experience and grow in faith in a simple and enjoyable way.

HOW DOES IT WORK? Our first three GIFT sessions at the beginning of this year were a great success with over 30 families joining together at St Nicholas School on Saturday mornings. Due to the current situation and our inability to meet together we are having to do things in a different way. We have invested in resources which are designed to support parents in sharing their faith and helping their families grow in knowledge and love of God, his creation, Jesus his Son and the wonderful gift of the Holy Spirit and his action in the world and our lives. We are offering these resources to any family who may be genuinely interested in and willing to engage in the process. This is not homework for children (!) but a real opportunity for families to share and enjoy their faith at home TOGETHER (which the Church has always described as the Domestic Church).

MONTHLY MEETING Each month we will meet parents for 30 minutes on ZOOM. We will familiarise you with the 'God calls' resources by focusing on: introducing you to the structure and format of the resources; exploring the catechesis and faith teaching of the resource and answering any questions you may have. The material concentrates on coaching you to teach and support your children in learning about faith. Following the Zoom call, you will be emailed the resources which can be used with the whole family during the month.
