In the East, this Season of Christmas is called the 'Time of Manifestation'. or Showing. Today is the 'Feast of the Manifestation', or the Showing of the Saviour to the whole world, to all nations. In the wise men who travel from the East. we see all the nations other than the people of Israel being welcomed at the New Temple of the New Covenant – the new born child in the manger. Today's Psalm response shows this: "All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord." The same is true of the key word in the second reading: "Revelation". Remember that for the people of Israel this was to be their Messiah. come to restore their fortunes. By this feast, we proclaim God's plan to extend his salvation to men and women of every nation, of every time and every place - including us. In many ways this is our Christmas Feast. when we celebrate the Good News of the Saviour's birth revealed at last to us.

Epiphany Blessing of Homes

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk at the Masses for Epiphany and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. The home blessing can be done as follows: Use the blessed chalk to write: 20 C M B 18 above the doorways (2018 for the year; C. M. B for the 3 Magi - Casper, Melchior and Balthasar and for 'Christus' Mansionem Benedicat'. Latin for "Christ Bless this House." As you are writing, pray the following prayer: Lord our God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Our Catholic Schools

Now the government may decide to keep this discriminatory policy in place instead of removing it.
