Where does authority come from? Jesus startles the crowds with a 'new teaching', but what amazes them is not the message but the authority behind it: they are convinced because what he does adds credibility to what he says. It's the familiar situation – we look through words to see the actions, which show us the real message. The scribes did not heal or work miracles, but simply talked about God. Jesus talks about the kingdom of God, but also shows the people what it is – a kingdom where all that damages human happiness is abolished. So we must listen to prophets or teachers when they are backed by such authority; so that we do not "harden our hearts" and ignore the message when we recognise that the messenger is sent by God. This demands that we too show, by our actions, that we have heard.

Racial Justice Sunday **Belonging: All are Welcome**

Today we are called to pray for those who experience unjust discrimination or are marginalised because of their race and ethnicity. We think in particular of those who feel they do not belong within our society or our communities because of this discrimination. As Catholics we are asked to treat all humans with dignity, regardless of their background or circumstance. There are many stories of alienation throughout the Bible, with clear calls to "Love the stranger". That the Church is a place where all belong is clearly seen in the recent Feast of Epiphany, when Christ is revealed not only to the Israelites, but to all of God's people. Today there will be a retiring collection for the work of CARJ the **Catholic Agency for Racial Justice**. Please pray for their work in what is an enormously important field. Some prayer cards are available in the church porch.
