

Gaudete et Exsultate

In the opening paragraphs of the latest Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate – On the call to Holiness in Today's World*, Pope Francis writes: "What follows is not meant to be a treatise on holiness, containing definitions and distinctions helpful for understanding this important subject, or a discussion of the various means of sanctification. My modest goal is to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time, with all its risks, challenges and opportunities. Root Yourself in Christ

Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself, and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the sacrament of Baptism. This is, as was stated earlier, the period of Mystagogy, when the newly baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ: it is not simply enough to “belong” to him: our belonging must be shown by the works we do, by the fruits we bear - while remembering of course that we cannot bear fruit except in him.

Every year an estimated 300,000 tonnes of used clothing goes to landfill in the UK. Currently, over 5% of the UK’s total annual carbon and water footprints result from clothing consumption. But if clothes stayed

in active use for nine months longer (extending their average life to around three years), this would reduce their carbon, water and waste footprints by 20-30%. In the average UK household, nearly a third of clothes (worth over £1,000 per household, £30 billion in total) haven’t been worn in the last year. We can all make a huge difference by taking small steps – for example by asking ourselves ‘do I need it’ before we buy, being better informed when we purchase clothing, choosing pre-owned options more frequently, learning long lost repair and fixing skills, getting creative with clothing and sharing and donating unwanted clothing. We should also keep old clothes out of the bin and drop them off at a local textile recycling bank instead. For more information, see

Feast of St Rita of Cascia

The Feast of the English Martyrs 4th May

On 4 May 1535, at Tyburn in London the first of many martyrs of the English Reformation were executed. The number included our own St Richard Reynolds, born in Pinhoe. Of these martyrs, forty-two have been canonised, and a further 242 have been declared Blessed; but the true number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or were tortured or persecuted for their faith cannot now be reckoned. The persecution lasted a hundred and fifty years and left a permanent mark on English culture: to this day Catholics continue to suffer certain minor disabilities under English law. The martyrs celebrated today came from every walk of life. There were rich and poor; married and single; men and women. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith and courage in the face of persecution.

From 2001, there are also celebrated on this day the forty martyrs of England and Wales who were canonised on 25 October 1970 and formerly celebrated on that day. They include Saints Cuthbert Mayne, John Houghton, Edmund Campion, and Richard Gwynn, as well as Saints John Roberts and Ambrose Barlow from the Benedictine monastery of St Gregory at Douay (now at Downside Abbey in Somerset).
