## The flow of peace

The link between today's first reading and Gospel is not immediately apparent, until we see the word 'peace'. The first reading presents us with a simple but beautiful image: a river of peace flowing out from the Lord. This notion of peace is reflected in the Gospel as the flowing of the disciples as they are sent out on their first mission. From the Lord of Peace, others (ourselves included), like ripples in a pool, flow out carrying his simple message: "Peace to this house!" Let us pray today that we will have the courage to go out and to bring his peace to the world.

## Safeguarding Training

Everyone volunteering to work with children and vulnerable adults **must** have safeguarding training. It is some time since any such training was done in Exeter so the diocese has arranged to come to Cardinal Newman House to offer this training on Saturday 13 July 10.00 for 10.30am start. This training is now being offered to all extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion Level 1 & 2 (*Ministers distributing Holy Communion at Mass as well as ministering to parishioners at home*). Even if you have undertaken training elsewhere we stress that this training is specifically tailored for Church ministry and Church communities and we are strongly advised that anyone involved in ministry in the parish, in whatever form, should attend. We appreciate this may seem to be onerous but it is vital to the well being of our parish family. Please let the parish office know you will be attending.
