When we consider the Christian life, we often think in positive terms: peace, light, joy, goodness, life. And yet, as the Scriptures remind us today, that Christian life must be lived in the midst of a world which is filled with more negative terms: division, distress, cruelty and death. The words of the Gospel may appear shocking to us: Jesus says that he comes to bring 'division, not peace', and this seems totally contrary to the message of the Gospel! And yet, Jesus is not announcing his desire, of course he wants peace, not division, but showing his understanding of the world in which we live. He is inviting us to weigh up the cost of the Kingdom, a cost he was willing to embrace: as the second reading tells us: "*Jesus, for the sake of the joy which was still in the future, endured the cross*". Whatever weighs us down, let us endure and persevere, so that the fire of God's love may blaze over the whole earth!

Caring for Our Common Home

This year World Day of Prayer for the Care
Of Creation falls on Sunday 1 September and
all parishes are asked to mark this day.
Recently at the Bishop's Conference meeting
the Bishops of England and Wales made this
statement on the current human and
ecological crisis: *"In the light of Pope
Francis' teaching in Laudato Si and*

*reaffirming our commitment to the principles
outlined in our document "The Call of
Creation, 2002", the Bishops' Conference
recognises that humanity is in an
unprecedented ecological crisis. There is a
moral duty to act with urgency and enable
the faithful to make informed decisions that
care for creation and will assist in repairing
the damage. We therefore urge the Church at
all levels to continue to develop initiatives
that care for our common home, and to
identify individuals and groups to be
advocates for this journey."*

The Bishops Conference's agency which is
leading on this important matter is CAFOD
and its current campaign *Our Common
Home* provides a good opportunity to
respond to the crisis through our parishes
and schools. The aims to stop the UK
contributing to climate change by 2045. We
are asked to complete a petition to the Prime
Minister. Schools are requested to invite
their local MP to visit and see for themselves
the practical response Catholic schools are
making to Laudato Si. All of this provides an
authentic witness to the Church's love for
the poorest of our brothers and sisters and
for creation. I encourage the priests,
teachers, parishes and schools to take part
in this campaign. More information on

St Augustine 28 August

Augustine was born in Thagaste in Africa of a Berber family. He was brought up a Christian but left the Church early and spent a great deal of time seriously seeking the truth, until at length, through the prayers of his mother and the teaching of St Ambrose of Milan, he was converted back to Christianity and baptized in 387, shortly before his mother's death. Augustine had a brilliant legal and academic career, but after his conversion he returned to Africa and led an ascetic life. He was elected Bishop of Hippo and spent 34 years looking after his flock, teaching them, strengthening them in the faith and protecting them strenuously against the errors of the time. His 'Confessions' are a landmark of world literature. The Second Readings in the Office of Readings contain extracts from many of his works. He was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Boniface VIII in 1308.
