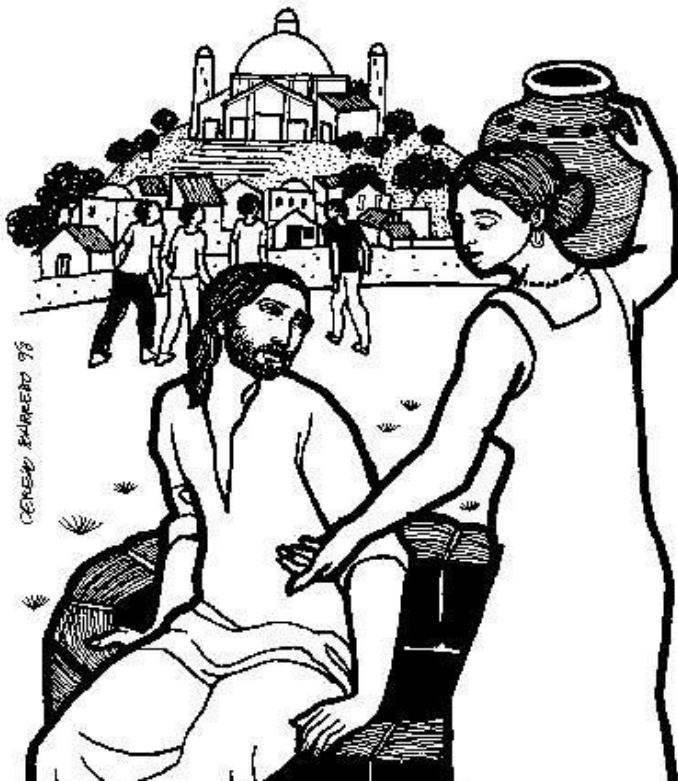

The Gospel of the third Sunday of Lent is the remarkable conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman by the well. The theme is water - which gives life, which cleanses, which is so necessary. This reading forms part of the catechesis given before Baptism at Easter: the candidates who would go into the water are invited to reflect on what that means. But more necessary than the water which gives life is the water which gives eternal life - the water of baptism, the water flowing from Jesus' side on the cross. As at Easter we will all renew our baptismal promises, so we should take this opportunity in Lent to reflect on what baptism has given us, and what God has done for us in this gift.

In addition to the advice last week from Bishop Mark, we have now been advised that shared hymn books should not be used. Also the collection bags should not be passed around. Instead they will be passed by the collectors but not handled by anyone else. Please continue to wash your hands regularly, and try not to touch surfaces. Parishioners who are sick or experiencing symptoms of sickness are not obliged to attend Mass, and out of charity they ought not to attend. The Catechism of the Catholic Church allows for this, for serious reason, • like illness. Coffee after Sunday 10.45am and Wednesday 9.30am Masses are suspended as will be the Thursday Lunch Club, for the moment, but this is only temporary until this situation has passed.
