

Blessed Sacrament Parish Heavitree Exeter 13 September 2020 Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Year A



I do not tell you to forgive seven times, but seventy seven times.

Jesus tells a dramatic story in the Gospel, to make a very important point: the desperate need in our world for forgiveness and reconciliation. How many chances do we

give each other? As many as seven? How often do we shut doors on people, even family and friends, saying 'That's it; you've just gone too far this time: never again'? When Jesus says that we must forgive 'seventy-seven' times, he implies that we never stop forgiving, whatever happens. He doesn't just say this, however: even when they do the worst thing that could be done to him, nailing him to a cross, Jesus puts these words into practice: 'Father, forgive them...' As his disciples, we must do likewise.

The Parish livesimply Sewing Group have been making face masks and some are available at church. The group are asking for a donation for the parish.


Smartloving Breakthrough Online Course

For all the Saints...

14 September The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

What are these Christians about, exalting an instrument of torture? Firstly, we rejoice that something so terrible should have been transformed into a means of redemption for the whole human race. Secondly, we remind ourselves of the fact that Christianity is not an abstract and spiritual religion. It springs from God's direct intervention in the affairs of the world, a real historical event involving real people and, in the end, a real execution on a real cross. We may theorise and theologise all we like; but all our theorisings and theologisings are nothing without the history on which they are based. Take away that history – take away the Cross – and Christianity is nonsense.

15 September Our Lady of Sorrows

"And you yourself a sword will pierce" Lk 2:35 The devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows flourished in the Middle Ages, and the hymn Stabat Mater was composed for it. Although it is officially celebrated today, the day after the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, popular devotion in many parts of the Mediterranean celebrates it with processions on the Friday before Holy Week.





16 September St Cornelius

Cornelius was made bishop of the church in Rome (Pope) in the year 251. He fought against the Novatian schismatics, those who thought that 'lapsed' Christians should be exiled from the Church, and established his authority with the aid of Cyprian. During the persecutions of Emperor Gallus Cornelius was sent into exile, and he died at Civitavecchia in June 253. He is buried in Rome.
