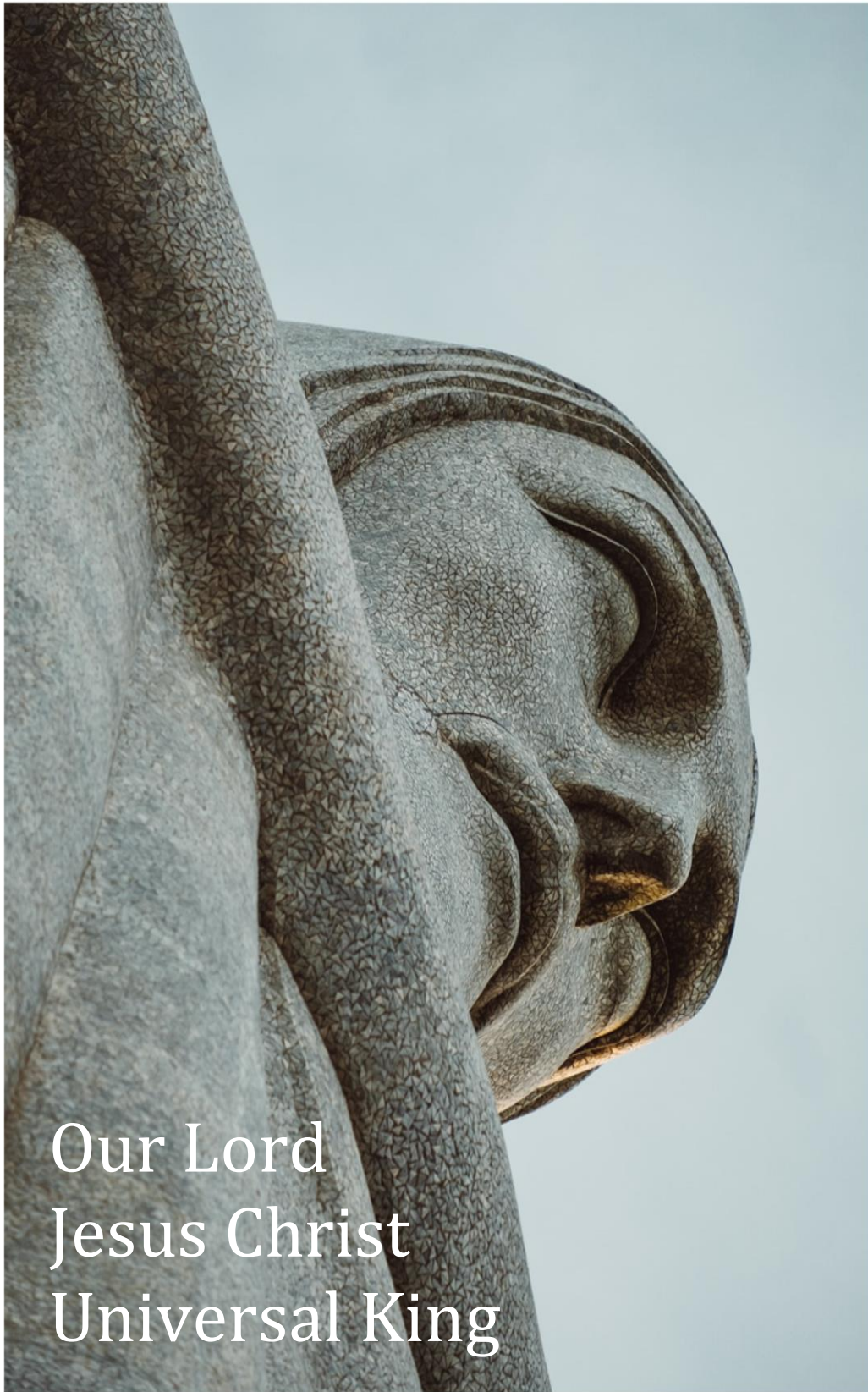

‘Shepherd-King o’er
mountain steep,
homeward guide thy
wand’ring sheep.’

This hymn which is often sung on this day captures the readings perfectly: our King is not a cruel tyrant or despot, but a shepherd who loves his flock, who would (and did) give his life for them. Love for the flock means that he will have to judge them, separating the sheep from those who do not belong to him. Coming to the end of the Church’s year leads us to look to our final ending, the homecoming the hymn speaks of. The judgement of the end of time we do not view as a trial or a terror, but as a coming home: look back to the Isaiah reading on the 28th Sunday to see what a homecoming party is offered. All we do is put our lives in order, living just and holy lives, longing for the day of the lord to come.

Christmas is NOT cancelled!

At the moment we are still unaware of what the Covid-19 restrictions will be at Christmas. We sincerely hope we will be able to celebrate Mass publicly, but it is likely that we will have to maintain the restrictions on numbers that were in place earlier in the year.

There will be four Christmas Masses:

CHRISTMAS EVE 6.00pm and 8.00pm

CHRISTMAS DAY 8.45am and 10.45am

To avoid disappointment book as early as possible and please remember to contact us to cancel if you change your mind or no longer need the place.

If you know someone who does not have access to email and so has not received this newsletter and would like to attend, let them know and you could book on their behalf. Please be generous and remember that space is limited.

These Masses (hopefully if all goes to plan!) will be streamed live so even if you are not able to come you will be able to join us.

Message from Bishop Mark about celebrations at Christmas

We all recognise that Christmas is an important time for all the faithful to attend Mass. COVID-19 restrictions will continue to limit the number of people at liturgical celebrations for safety reasons, even after the 2 December. At our Bishops' Conference meeting this week we agreed that since the Solemnity of Christmas has an Octave, we would take a joint approach in encouraging the faithful to attend Holy Mass on any day during the Octave, to enter into the mystery of the Incarnation. It will also be important to encourage people to 'mark' the preparation for Christmas as well as the celebration of Christmas and the Octave, *domestically* in their homes. This will assist them in marking this important solemnity, as well as coming to Church for Mass, if possible, at some point in the Octave.

Sleep on the floor for a night



It's hard to believe that in this day and age, there are children who do not have a warm and comfy bed to sleep in at night. In fact one in five children living in the southwest are living in poverty. Some areas in our Diocese fall into the top 10% of the most deprived areas in England. As part of our Good Shepherd programme, this Christmas the **Catholic Children's Society**

(Plymouth) is asking children living in our Diocese to think of children less fortunate than themselves by putting themselves in their shoes just for one night.

We are asking children living in the diocese to give up their bed for one night to sleep on the floor. If 100 children could raise £10 each in sponsorship, CCSP could buy beds and mattresses for 10 children, so they never have to sleep on the floor again. 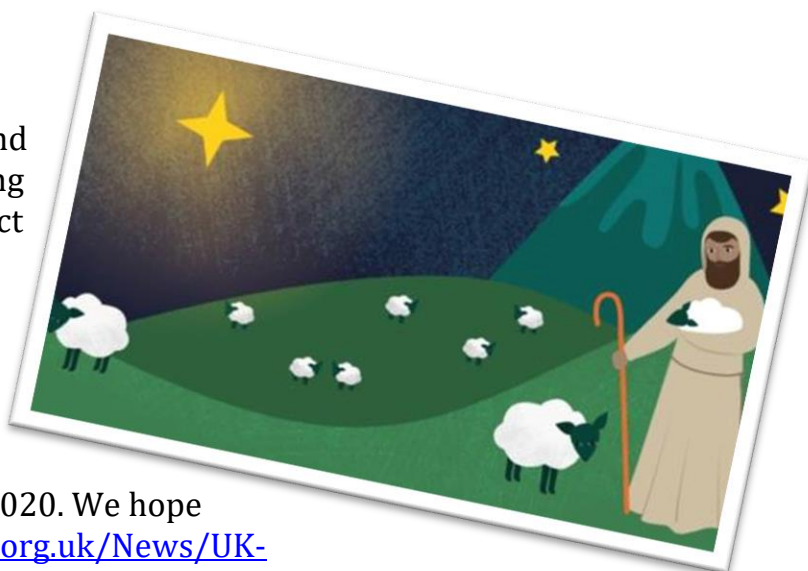

GIFT Growing In Faith Together

WHAT IS IT? GIFT is for families of faith; for families with children who are looking forward to receiving Holy Communion; for families with older children who want to be confirmed in their faith; for families with younger children who want to experience and grow in faith in a simple and enjoyable way.

HOW DOES IT WORK? Our first three GIFT sessions at the beginning of this year were a great success with over 30 families joining together at St Nicholas School on Saturday mornings. Due to the current situation and our inability to meet together we are having to do things in a different way. We have invested in resources which are designed to support parents in sharing their faith and helping their families grow in knowledge and love of God, his creation, Jesus his Son and the wonderful gift of the Holy Spirit and his action in the world and our lives. We are offering these resources to any family who may be genuinely interested in and willing to engage in the process. This is not homework for children (!) but a real opportunity for families to share and enjoy their faith at home TOGETHER (which the Church has always described as the Domestic Church).

MONTHLY MEETING Each month we will meet parents for 30 minutes on ZOOM. We will familiarise you with the 'God calls' resources by focusing on: introducing you to the structure and format of the resources; exploring the catechesis and faith teaching of the resource and answering any questions you may have. The material concentrates on coaching you to teach and support your children in learning about faith. Following the Zoom call, you will be emailed the resources which can be used with the whole family during the month.

EHP Pop-up Giving Hub -



Exeter Homeless Partnership (EHP) are very excited to announce that we are going to have a pop-up Giving Hub in Roman Walk, Princesshay from 19 November to the end of December. The shop unit will provide a

space for a host of different things to happen, these will include:

- A place to donate items such as coats, sleeping bags, hats and gloves (we will be working with St Petrock's to create a regular wish list);
- An alternative giving hub – a unit in the window so people can donate 24/7 and a mobile giving unit in the shop if people want to come in for a chat when they donate;
- A TV screen will show videos, images, ways to get involved and will also show a montage of videos from a wide range of people from across the city answering the question "What does home mean to you?"
- An interactive plinth will provide people with the opportunity to learn more about EHP and to complete a questionnaire (with prizes) that will help us gather a wide understanding of people's current knowledge of homelessness, this will play an important role in helping us decide on next steps for EHP during the coming year;
- Individuals, organisations, businesses will also be encouraged to sign up to the EHP charter and join the citywide conversation to end homelessness in Exeter.

We plan to open the Hub from 10.00am-4.00pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday. It's no mean feat to staff the hub for that amount of time and we would really like to hear from anyone who is able to volunteer their time to help us. Of course we will be following all COVID guidelines, and provide PPE and training. If you are interested and able to donate your time (whole day 10am-4pm; or half day 10-1pm, or 1pm-4pm) then please get in touch.

From the Office of the Bishop

A Message to the Diocese for the weekend of 14-15th November 2020

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

I write to express my sorrow, and my solidarity with you at this time. It has been painful and shaming for us to read, or hear about, the *Report* from the *Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse*, which was published this week. I know that whatever we experience, is but a shadow of the agony and pain caused to victims-survivors, who were abused within our Church. Their voices must continue to be fully heard. Such individuals are persons with immense dignity, who make an invaluable contribution in finding the right way forward for all of us. To anyone who carries this burden or who has been hurt in any way, I say how sorry I am. Please let us know if there is anything we can do. We must do all we can to continue to listen to your stories and to provide the proper accompaniment, if you are open to that, from us. Our prayer for you, is that this process will help you find some healing.

The *Report*, along with the *Independent Review into Safeguarding*, conducted by Mr Ian Elliot, on behalf of the Church, and which has taken place over the past months, will be key in informing our ongoing work of Safeguarding in the Church. The bishops will reflect on these next week during our regular meeting.

Let us be vigilant in strengthening the procedures which the Church has embraced these past years, and which are used in collaboration with the statutory authorities. I want to thank most especially all those generous people, Catholic and non-Catholic, who are an important part of our Safeguarding processes.

This is an important point in our journey of Safeguarding. One which in many ways, brings many of us to our knees but, in humility, that is a good place to begin again from. Please keep all those engaged in this work in your prayers, but above all, those who have suffered abuse in their lives. I attach some contact details for anyone who has suffered. I would be open to hearing from anybody in the Diocese who wanted to share their experience with me.

Covid-19 Safety Guidelines for your crib!

The coronavirus pandemic has had a huge impact on the way we conduct our lives, with many new rules and restrictions governing our health and safety. One area of concern is your Christmas Crib. Although there are several weeks to go before Christmas, you will need to start planning now. You will need to begin with a thorough risk assessment to ensure your Crib is COVID-secure. Here is some further guidance:

- 1 A maximum of 4 shepherds only are permitted in the Crib at any one time.
- 2 Shepherds must wear face masks (unless exempt) and strictly observe social distancing (2m or 1m+ with mitigations).
- 3 Jesus, Mary and Joseph form a family bubble and thus may be placed together.
- 4 The ox and the ass need Declaration of Non-Contamination Certificates, obtainable from the Department of Agriculture.
- 5 The Three Wise Men, since they come from a non Schengen Area, will be subject to a 14 day quarantine, whether or not they have tested negative for Covid-19.
- 6 The straw, moss, palm branches and other decorations must be disinfected, with hands washed for 20 seconds after handling.
- 7 Angels flying over the Crib are now forbidden, owing to the aerosol effect produced by the batting of wings.
- 8 Shepherds are permitted provided they are not more than 70 years old or suffering from underlying medical conditions or in another vulnerable category.
- 9 The Inn, along with other businesses in the hospitality sector, is closed until further notice.
