

Make his paths straight

Throughout the first three weeks of Advent our focus is very clearly on the Second Coming of the Lord - not so much on the run up to Christmas (until the last week). If we view Advent as a preparation for Christmas these readings will make little sense - and neither will the figure of John the Baptist who appears today: if it's about the preparation for Christmas, then John the Baptist, preaching after Jesus was born, is a confusing figure: but his role is to preach to us, as he did of old, and to prepare us for the (second) coming of the Lord. Today we have a very graphic reference to the end of time and the Second Coming in the reading from Saint Peter; it is a frightening picture, and so the first reading offers tender words of comfort to help us understand who is coming, and why we should be ready to meet him.

Second Sunday of Advent



Today we light the second of the candles on our Advent wreath. As the light grows we are conscious that hope is growing in the world for an end to the pandemic with the successful production of the vaccines. There is an article below from the Bishops Conference of England and Wales which may help to quell some of the anxieties surrounding the vaccines. It is worth a read. It is often repeated that we are not out of the woods yet, so we continue to look out for one another and to stay safe and well.

Exeter Children's Hot Food Project

Set-up in May, this project is run by a team of volunteers who have provided hot nutritious meals to school children and families experiencing food poverty throughout the first 'lockdown' and during the school holidays. The meals are cooked at churches and community centres then delivered immediately. They are recruiting volunteers to help across the Christmas holidays and in the New Year plan to extend this 'emergency food' service to other groups vulnerable to food insecurity such as isolated elders and young carers and care leavers.

Update on COVID-19 and Vaccination from the Bishops' Conference

Thursday, December 3, 2020

On 24 September 2020 the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales issued a statement <u>COVID-19 and Vaccination</u>. In the light of the recent breakthrough in vaccine development we now wish to issue a follow up statement.

The development of a vaccine against COVID-19 presents an important breakthrough in protecting others as well as oneself from the virus; a virus which has not only caused a global pandemic and led to a huge loss of life but has also placed a great burden on healthcare workers and systems. Each of us has a duty to protect others from infection with its danger of serious illness, and for some, death. A vaccine is the most effective way to achieve this unless one decides to self-isolate. At present, debate concerns the use of the vaccines developed by Pfizer & BioNTech, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Some have guestioned the use of the AstraZeneca vaccine since it has been developed from cell-lines originating from the cells of an aborted foetus in 1983. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and the Pontifical Academy of Life have expressed the view that one may in good conscience and for a grave reason receive a vaccine sourced in this way, provided that there is a sufficient moral distance between the present administration of the vaccine and the original wrongful action. In the COVID-19 pandemic, we judge that this grave reason exists and that one does not sin by receiving the vaccine. Both the Pfizer & BioNTech and Moderna vaccines have a different source since they are mRNA-based vaccines. On 2 December 2020, the Pfizer & BioNTech vaccine was approved for use in the UK. Each Catholic must educate his or her conscience on this matter and decide what to do, also bearing in mind that a vaccine must be safe, effective, and universally available, especially to the poor of the world. Catholics may in good conscience receive any of these vaccines for the good of others and themselves. In good conscience, one may refuse a particular vaccine but continues to have a duty to protect others from infection.

Catholic Women's League – alive and kicking!

During these long eight months, the Catholic Women's League in the three Exeter parishes has not been idle. Although not able to meet, contact has been maintained within the Exeter Section, and also by frequent letters containing information and encouragement sent from the National Office, all maintaining the purposes of the League - of Charity, Work and Loyalty. Support for our parishes has continued throughout the past year, and by making the most of the first few free months, monies in excess of £2000 has been raised and divided among seven charities, local and international. These are St Petroc's, Julian House, FORCE, Exeter Leukaemia Fund and Exeter Community Initiative - all local: while help to The Sisters of the Presentation of Mary's Children's Home in the Philippines, and Mary's Meals provide essential help far away. Help in kind has also been given to the Apostleship of the Sea. The League, active for well over 100 years, remains loyal to its principles here in Exeter, while its members enjoy its association with their parishes and with each other.

Sleep on the floor for a night

It's hard to believe that in this day and age, there are children who do not have a warm and comfy bed to sleep in at night. In fact one in five children living in the southwest are living in poverty. Some areas in our Diocese fall into the top 10% of the most deprived areas in England. As part of our Good Shepherd programme, this Christmas the **Catholic Children's Society (Plymouth)** is asking children living in our Diocese to think of children less fortunate than themselves by putting themselves in their shoes just for one night.

We are asking children living in the diocese to give up their bed for one night to sleep on the floor. If 100 children could raise £10 each in sponsorship, CCSP could buy beds and mattresses for 10 children, so they never have to sleep on the floor again. We are very excited to announce that we are going to have a pop-up Giving Hub in Roman Walk, Princesshay from 19 November to the end of December. The shop unit will provide a space for a host of different things to happen, these will include:

• A place to donate items such as coats, sleeping bags, hats and gloves (we will be working with St Petrock's to create a regular wish list);

• An alternative giving hub – a unit in the window so people can donate 24/7 and a mobile giving unit in the shop if people want to come in for a chat when they donate;

• A TV screen will show videos, images, ways to get involved and will also show a montage of videos from a wide range of people from across the city answering the question "What does home mean to you?"

• An interactive plinth will provide people with the opportunity to learn more about EHP and to complete a questionnaire (with prizes) that will help us gather a wide understanding of

people's current knowledge of homelessness, this will play an important role in helping us decide on next steps for EHP during the coming year;

• Individuals, organisations, businesses will also be encouraged to sign up to the EHP charter and join the citywide conversation to end homelessness in Exeter.

We plan to open the Hub from 10.00am-4.00pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday. It's no mean feat to staff the hub for that amount of time and we would really like to hear from anyone who is able to volunteer their time to help us. Of course we will be following all COVID guidelines, and provide PPE and training. If you are interested and able to donate your time (whole day 10am-4pm; or half day 10-1pm, or 1pm-4pm) then please get in touch.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Tuesday 8 December

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is the doctrine that the Virgin Mary was conceived without *original sin,* that twist in our nature that makes our will tend not to follow what it knows to be right. It was this grace that enabled Mary to give a true and considered "Yes" to the request, conveyed by the Angel Gabriel that she should consent to be the mother of the incarnate God. The doctrine was almost universally believed over the centuries but was only formally defined as a doctrine of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1854. Because it is so old, it is one of the Marian doctrines that Islam shares with the Catholic Church, though of course the theological details are very different.


