The leprosy left him at once and he was cured.

Thankfully, we do not encounter leprosy in our culture. It can therefore be difficult to enter into the real depth of today's readings. We have to understand that leprosy meant exclusion, rejection and the end of "normal" life. For your leprosy to be cured would be like being given a second chance at life. What is the cause of exclusion and rejection in our society – or even in the Church? Who are those who must "live apart"? And how can we put into effect in our day those most touching of the words of Jesus, when asked if he wants to cure the leper: "Of course I want to!"? Contemplating exclusion and rejection in our world can be hard work: Saint Paul guides the way: the Christian path is not to work "for my own advantage, but for the advantage of everybody else".

Lockdown Lent?

It was the fourth Monday of Lent last year that we went into the first of our national lockdowns. And now here we are preparing to celebrate Lent again. On one level we could say that little has changed, on another we know that for the majority of people life is completely different. Families have been devastated by the death of loved ones. Many we know have suffered, not just from the virus, but from the knock on effects it has had on the provision of healthcare. Our schools have had to change the way they offer education to our young people. Leaving the house for many is still a step too far. Church is a different thing. It's hard to remember that we celebrated Easter at all. And yet we are an EASTER people. It always amazes me that in Catholic hymn books there are often twice as many songs for Lent as there are for Easter! Why is that? It can't simply be Catholic guilt. Perhaps it's that we are not really sure of the Resurrection. Perhaps because it sounds so far fetched we find it difficult to make sense of it and therefore struggle to celebrate it. But without Easter Lent becomes an exercise in navel gazing, a pointless journey into the self that can, if we're not careful lead to a dead end. Easter is about hope and if Easter is about hope then so is Lent. Without the resurrection, death is final, literally the dead end! Without forgiveness, sorrow leads nowhere. So as we hope for an end to the pandemic, as we hope for the easing of restrictions, as we hope for the health and well being of all people, let us also look to the future hope of the

resurrection revealed to us by Jesus Christ. This is the Good News we proclaim. Faith in this truth is what defines us as Christians. It is this hope that we bring to the world.

As the lockdown has not yet been eased we have decided to continue to suspend public Masses at Blessed Sacrament. I am sure the church is a safe place, but we are told to stay at home so we act in solidarity with the general population and for the good of others.

What about Ash Wednesday? Whilst we will not be distributing ashes at Mass, you can still mark the day by fasting and abstinence. Make a plan for yourself and your family about how to make the day different. What will you eat, or fast from? Mass will be streamed live at 9.30am and then available on the parish YouTube channel so you can tune in and celebrate at any time, joining in prayer with the rest of the community. And below are two really good opportunities to make Lent a fruitful time. The wonderful Lent Extra from Redemptorist Publications and the Wednesday evening bible study.

So have a happy, hope filled Lent. We continue to pray for one another. *Fr Jonathan*

Catholic Children's Society Plymouth

2020 really was an unprecedented year for everyone and at CCSP, all our fundraising activities were cancelled and those which we were able to run, were adversely affected due to the lockdown restrictions in place. At a time when our income was severely reduced, the number of

grant applications continued to rise as more vulnerable families felt the effects of Covid-19. We had to look for alternative and innovative sources of fundraising such as Crowdfunding and donations by text, to replace lost income and we were fortunate to receive an additional £27,000 of Covid-19 funding in 2020, which was allocated to 125 families last year.

Our sponsored 'Sleep on the Floor for a Night' was also a success and we have almost reached £2,000 with sponsorship money still coming in, which is double what we were hoping to raise! Thank you to all the children in our parishes, who helped to support this event by sleeping on the floor for one night during the Christmas holidays.

Do you know a family who might need our help? We have successfully bid for a further £21,000 of funding so far in 2021, thanks to Caritas and a joint funding bid with them, the Gubay Foundation Trust have given us £15,000, and the Devon Coronavirus Fund have also given us another £6,000. This money will be used to provide financial support to vulnerable children and their families through our Essential Grants programme, where the basic essentials of life such as children's beds, white goods like cookers, fridge/freezers and washing machines and also school uniform including school shoes can be bought by us for vulnerable children and their families living in the Diocese. We have been actively promoting our Essential Grants programme in Dorset and Cornwall, as we are particularly keen to receive application forms for our help from families living in these counties, as well as Devon. Something worth dying for – St Valentine's Day





On 14 February every year, couples around the world celebrate one of the heroes of Catholic history. As the story goes, Valentine was a Roman priest who married young couples in secret despite the decree of Emperor Claudius II forbidding all weddings. The emperor did this to more readily recruit young, unattached men into his armies. Valentine was

discovered, arrested and eventually executed. St Valentine didn't officiate secret weddings simply out of compassion for local, love-struck couples. He did it because Catholic marriage is about a whole lot more than just two people committing to live together and maybe raise a few kids. Catholic marriage has a purpose beyond the fulfilment of the two spouses. It is a call to honour God by living in service to each other, helping each other, and our children, to grow closer to God and to our destiny to be with Christ, our eternal bridegroom, for eternity. It is also a Sacrament – a living witness of God's presence in the world. As such, it has a number of characteristics that define it. Encapsulated in the marriage rite, these characteristics include permanency, sexual intimacy, sexual exclusivity, unconditional sharing, openness to children and a willingness to raise any children in the Catholic faith. 
