

He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another

This world, as we know, is a fragile and fallible place, in which we encounter hunger, disease, sickness and death. Jesus proclaims, by his actions of healing, that there is another world, the Kingdom of God, which will be free from all such anxieties and afflictions. The story of Paradise and the Garden of Eden painted a picture of a world which was perfect, and free from all problems. Jesus came into the world precisely to offer us a return to Eden, if we follow him. Each of his miracles is also, in some sense, a parable or teaching, pointing out to us something of the lost happiness and perfection which he is restoring. This vision of Paradise is not Utopian or delusory, not just a vain hope to comfort us with, but the true manifestation of God's love for us. Jesus could not cure every disease or sickness in the world then: but his miracles of healing are a sign that one day, when the Kingdom comes, sickness and disease will be wiped away for ever.

YMCA Exeter are delighted to finally let everyone into their secret! Exeter has a huge housing crisis and it's affecting our young people. The last year alone has seen the council housing need increase by a further 24% with over 350 local young people waiting for 1-bed accommodation. We firmly believe that God has been guiding us

over the last three years as we have explored housing options. We are so excited to tell you that we've just begun work on a groundbreaking initiative to tackle the problem head on - to provide affordable and secure accommodation to local, young people. Thanks to significant investment from Homes England and Exeter City Council, we have been able to buy an abandoned warehouse in the heart of the city centre and we are transforming it into 26 self-contained studio apartments. The newly named, 'Sidwell Studios' is being specifically built to create a fantastic community feel within the city, whilst regenerating the area and providing an asset to the locality and real, affordable housing options for local young people. One Bible verse that has constantly come to mind as we've developed this project is Proverbs 24:3-4: *"By wisdom a house is built, and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures."*

We firmly believe that the young people are the rare and beautiful treasures that will fill the rooms of Sidwell Studios. And we believe that God is calling us to help establish young people – many of whom have experienced constant upheaval - into a secure environment from which they can flourish into all that God has planned for them. For that reason we're going to be focusing a lot on the idea of being 'Established' over the coming year. In fact we love the idea so much that we've developed a new campaign that we'd love you to partner with us in: <u>Established [2022]</u> We've already received funding to cover 85% of the costs to transform the old warehouse in the city centre, we're just £525,000 short. Support for Children and Young People

Laptops and tablets are available from the DfE to support children who do not already have access to a device for remote learning. Parents, carers, and pupils can contact their school who can request one on their behalf.

The Government has also said it is going to provide extra funding to support schools to provide food parcels or meals to children who are eligible for free school meals. Where schools cannot offer food parcels or use local solutions, a national voucher scheme will be in place so that eligible children, who meet the qualification criteria due to low income, can access free school meals while they are remotely learning from home. Further details on the national voucher scheme can be found by clicking <u>this link</u>

In Devon, schools are working with their catering providers so that meals continue to be available to any eligible pupils attending school – including all infants and those receiving benefits-related free school meals – as well as eligible pupils who are now learning from home.


Ave Maria Crisis Pregnancy Support


