14 March 2021. Fourth Sunday of Lent. Laetare Sunday Year B



God sent his Son, so that through him the world might be saved

There were two remarkable moments in the story of the Old Testament where God saved his people; one was in the escape from Egypt – we'll keep that for the Easter Vigil. The other was the end of their second exile, this time in Babylon, which we hear of today.

Of course there was an even greater moment when God saved his people: the work of Jesus Christ, the Son of God – and we hear Jesus tell Nicodemus about that today. Today's theme is 'salvation': but to understand 'being saved', we must ask "What from?" Saved from slavery, from exile, from human enemies – these are all clear. But the last and greatest salvation brought by Jesus is harder to understand: saved from sin and death. These threaten us as much as any other enemy, and our salvation in Jesus is as real as any other.

In the weeks of Lent so far we have followed God's work of salvation: we have seen the Covenants he established with Noah, Abraham, Moses and the people of Israel after the return from Babylon. Now we come to one of the most significant parts of the Old Testament: the promise of a brand new Covenant, which will be different from all those that went before. This Covenant will see God and Man living more closely together. For the ratification of a Covenant, something was always sacrificed as a sign

of the new relationship – normally man would offer some animal offering to God. But the New Covenant will be ratified not with the death of sheep or bull, but by the death of Jesus Christ, God and Man. In this perfect sacrifice is the source of our eternal salvation.

Laetare Sunday 14 March

Today we celebrate Laetare Sunday. Laetare is the Latin word for 'to rejoice'.

It doesn't feel as though we have much to rejoice about this year. We are still in lockdown and things are only improving slowly. But just as there are signs of spring emerging, the buds on the trees, the bulbs blooming and the days getting longer, so there are signs of improvement in the situation surrounding the pandemic; the roll out of vaccines, schools filled once more and the numbers of those seriously ill also dropping. In the Church we are rejoicing because we are coming closer to the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Just as the disciples' despair at his death on the cross turned to joy and exaltation at his rising from the dead, so we place our hope once more in the promises he makes to us, that death has been defeated and the Light of his life has overcome the darkness of fear.

Today we also celebrate Mothering Sunday. We give thanks for the gift of motherhood and pray especially for all the mothers of our community, both living and dead. We pray for those mothers who have suffered the loss of their children and loved ones and we pray too for those who long to be mothers, that the Lord may bless them with the gift of children. May Mary, the Mother of Jesus bring consolation, peace and joy.

Resumption of Public Worship

Public worship will resume at Blessed Sacrament on Palm Sunday 28 March.

Sunday Masses will be at the usual times of 8.45, 10.45am and 6.00pm.

The rules on track and trace, hand sanitising, the wearing of face masks, social distancing and no mixing of households will still apply. Because of this there will be a limit on the number of places available at all services and we will be employing a booking system for Palm Sunday and the Easter Triduum. **Bookings can now be made, preferably by email, to the parish office.**

All liturgies of the Easter Triduum and all Sunday and weekday Masses will be streamed live from the church on the [Blessed Sacrament YouTube channel](#).

We will be offering several occasions for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the early days of Holy Week.

Caritas Plymouth News Update - March 2021

Welcome to a short summary of some of the charitable work that Caritas Plymouth is currently engaged in, as well as some of the advocacy and educational work that we hope will contribute to longer term change.

Funding Update

Caritas Food Poverty Fund 2021

We are delighted to have received a further £40,000 in February 2021 from the Albert Gubay Charitable Foundation to provide support to individuals and families struggling financially due to the pandemic. This is part of a second donation given to the Catholic Church in England and Wales to support those in most need. The distribution of the funds will be managed by Caritas Plymouth. Bishop Mark welcomed the donation:

'We are immensely thankful for this second, very generous grant that the Diocese of Plymouth has received. We know from our work in 2020 that the ongoing pandemic is having a negative impact on everyone, but in particular on individuals and families who are struggling financially. May the Lord continue to bless the Gubay family for their continued commitment to providing practical support to those most in need at this time.'

The funds will be distributed in two ways:

- Support for organisations providing food hampers or vouchers (managed by Caritas Plymouth). For details email: caritas@prcdtr.org.uk or call 01364 645421. Applications will only be accepted from organisations and not from individuals.

Intergenerational Project

Caritas Plymouth has been awarded £30,000 by Care Home Friends and Neighbours to develop an Intergenerational Linking project. This will be led by the Caritas team who support and enable social action projects across the diocese, working in partnership with Plymouth CAST, the Catholic Multi-Academy Trust. The project will build on our existing experience linking schools and older people. We have seen for ourselves the benefits of intergenerational projects; enriching lives, developing new skills, giving a sense of living history to younger people and keeping older people connected to a rapidly changing world. 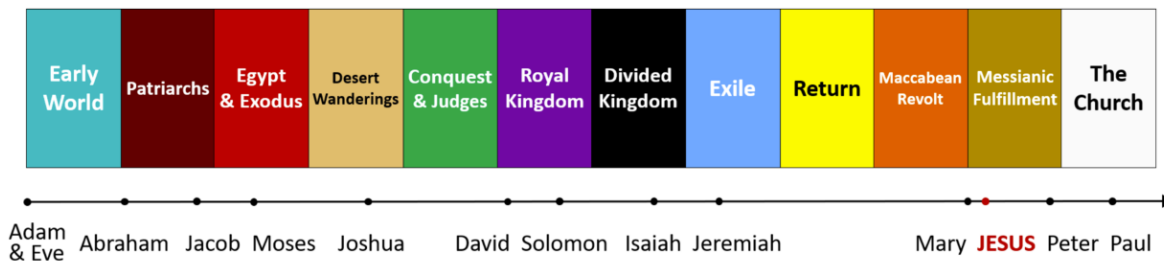

For all the Saints...

17 March St Patrick (385 - 461)

He was born in Roman Britain around the end of the 4th century, and died in Ireland about the middle of the 5th century. As a missionary bishop, he endured many hardships and faced opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Nevertheless, he worked hard to conciliate, to evangelize, and to educate local chieftains and their families. He is remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the gospel to the very people who had enslaved him in his youth.



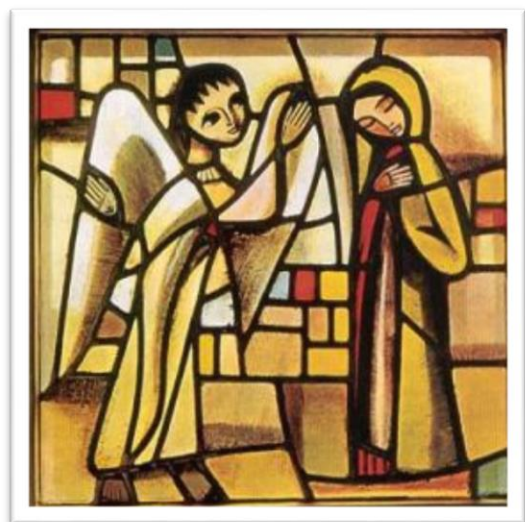
19 March St Joseph Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Nothing is known of St Joseph except what is said of him in the Gospels. He was a carpenter; he accepted the will of God; and he supported Mary and brought up Jesus. From the human character of his son we can see that he was a good and responsible father. He is widely venerated as a patron of artisans who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, and of workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration.

25 March The Annunciation of the Lord



The Solemnity of the Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son. We are continually reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the joyous mysteries of the Rosary and the Angelus. The feast of the Annunciation began to be celebrated on this day during the fourth and fifth centuries, soon after the date for celebrating Christmas was universalized throughout the Church. This feast celebrates the Incarnation of the Second

Person of the Trinity and the salvation of all mankind. This point of our salvation was deeply discussed by many of the Church fathers, to explain it to the faithful and to show the deep love God has for us. Some of the Church fathers who wrote on this were St. Athanasius, St. Gregory of Nyssa and St. Augustine.

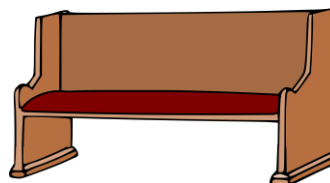

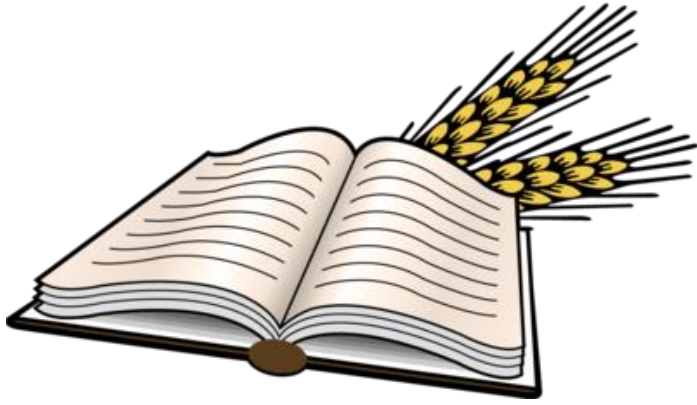
