

I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you

The readings for this Sunday remind us that God knows our hearts and wants us to belong to him, not to the world. The second reading tells us to be united with God in love. And in the gospel Jesus prays for his disciples, that they are kept safe and be consecrated to the Good News. So this week's focus can be on commitment, rejecting evil, and living lives of service. Jesus' love for his disciples does not fade, it endures eternally. He asks the Father to protect and guide them. He entrusts us, his friends and companions, to the loving care of his Father. Parents and guardians spend their best years guiding children in life and in faith. Then there is a gradual letting go as they grow into adulthood. Like Jesus we should pray for those who move beyond our active care. The Father's arms are a safe place for them.

### Novena on the Care of Creation

We invite all Catholics in England and Wales to respond in prayer and action to the urgent climate change issues that we all face. The God Who Speaks team offers this novena of readings and prayers drawn from the Bible and recent Papal teaching. Between Ascension and Pentecost, the Scriptures tell us: "All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers..." (Acts 1:14) while they awaited to be "clothed with power from on high." Luke 24:49. We are invited to pray these nine days reflecting on the account of creation in the book of Genesis. # For all the Saints...

Saturday 22 May Saint Rita of Cascia She was born near Cascia, in Umbria in Italy. She was married at the age of 12 despite her frequently repeated wish to become a nun. Her husband was rich, quick-tempered and immoral and had many enemies. She endured his insults, abuse and infidelities for 18 years and bore him two sons, who grew to be like him. Towards the end of his life she helped to convert her husband to a more pious way of life, but he was stabbed to death by his enemies not long afterwards. He repented before he died and was reconciled to the Church. Her sons planned to avenge their father's death. When Rita's pleas were unavailing, she praved that God should take their lives if that was the only way to preserve them from the sin of murder. They died of natural causes a year later. Rita asked to join the convent of St Mary Magdalen at Cascia. She was rejected for being a widow, since the convent was for virgins only, and later given the impossible task of reconciling her family

with her husband's murderers. She carried out the task and was allowed to enter the convent at the age of 36. She remained there until her death at the age of 70. She is widely honoured as a patron saint of impossible or lost causes.
