# A prophet is only despised in his own country

A prophet's job is to open people's eyes to the reality of their situation - pointing out to them the things they would rather forget or ignore. A prophet is a sort of 'national conscience', always awake to situations of injustice and always speaking out about them. A prophet is commissioned to do this by God, who sends the prophet on his

mission. Jesus is just such a prophet - teaching and preaching about the Kingdom of God and the best way to live. Despite the welcome his message has received elsewhere, when he comes to his hometown he is faced with rejection -such that 'he was amazed at their lack of faith.' It is curious that they seem to accept his wisdom, and his miracles, but because he grew up among them they cannot accept him as a teacher from God. We should remember that it is often hardest to stand up for the truth among those who know us well.

#### World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Pope Francis has established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, taking place for the first time on **Sunday July 25**. 'Grandparents'... vital contribution to the family, the Church and society was never as important as now... We can never fail so long as we keep on doing what we are doing - praying, showing the way and passing on our faith'. They want them to be good, decent human beings, to know the difference between right and wrong, able to make good moral decisions and, if they go astray along the way, to be able to find their way back to a loving, forgiving, non-judgemental God.

#### CAFOD - Vaccine commitments from the G7

Vaccine commitments from the G7 not enough to end the pandemic. Campaign groups including CAFOD have said a commitment by G7 countries to provide an additional one billion vaccines to poorer nations over the next year was insufficient, given the group's pledge to "vaccinate the world by getting as many safe vaccines to as many people as possible as fast as possible". Aisha Dodwell, Head of Campaigns at CAFOD, said: "Rich countries have secured more than enough vaccines to cover their own populations, but what they are offering the rest of the world will only help a fraction of those yet to be vaccinated. If G7 leaders are serious about securing vaccines for all, then they should all support proposals for a waiver to the COVID vaccine patent put forward by South Africa and India and backed by an increasing number of world leaders, including Joe Biden and Emmanuel Macron."

# Death by Appointment A Rational Guide to the Assisted Suicide Debate

Would you benefit from a rational guide to the assisted suicide debate? That's what's on offer to attendees of an online event called 'Death by Appointment'.

The Assisted Suicide debate has been pushed centre stage once more in 2021 with Baroness Meacher's Assisted Dying Bill introduced into the House of Lords. Bishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues, has already outlined the Catholic Church's opposition to the Bill – a Bill that could make assisted suicide legal in England and Wales.

Online Event: On Monday 12 July at 7:30 – 9.00pm, Baroness Ilora Finlay and Robert Preston will look behind the slogans of the debate to help inform your view. Visit the event page on Eventbrite.

Founding Director of Living and Dying Well, Robert is a former civil servant and parliamentary official. Baroness Finlay is a cross-bench member of the House of Lords and one of Europe's leading palliative care consultants. Both have extensive experience of this complex and sensitive subject. They make clear from the outset that, in their view, the case being made for changing the law to legalise physician-assisted suicide does not stack up. From law, to clinical practice, social attitudes, end of life care, public safety and the experience of those jurisdictions, they carefully lay out their evidence in a manner that recognises and respects that others may see the matter differently. That's something of a rarity in this emotionally-charged area of discussion. Bishop John Sherrington will introduce the evening and the National Board of Catholic Women will join Baroness Finlay and Robert Preston in conversation. There will also be a question and answer session after the presentations.

This virtual event is supported by the Bishops' Conference's Department of Social Justice. A Zoom link will be provided 24 hours before the event. # Emerging from restrictions?



# FOR ALL THE SAINTS...



15 July St Bonaventure, Bishop & Doctor (1218-1274)

Bonaventure was born at Bagnoregio in Etruria in about 1218. He became a Franciscan in 1243 and studied philosophy and theology at the University of Paris. He became a famous teacher and philosopher, part of the extraordinary intellectual flowering of the 13th century. He was a friend and colleague of St Thomas Aquinas. At this time the friars were still a new and revolutionary force in the Church, and their radical embracing of poverty and rejection of institutional structures raised suspicion and

opposition from many quarters. Bonaventure defended the Franciscan Order and, after he was elected general of the order in 1255, he ruled it with wisdom and prudence. He is regarded as the second founder of the Order.

He declined the archbishopric of York in 1265 but was made cardinal bishop of Albano in 1273, dying a year later in 1274 at the Council of Lyons, at which the Greek and Latin churches were (briefly) reconciled.

Bonaventure wrote extensively on philosophy and theology, making a permanent mark on intellectual history; but he always insisted that the simple and uneducated could have a clearer knowledge of God than the wise. He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1588 by Pope Sixtus V.
