

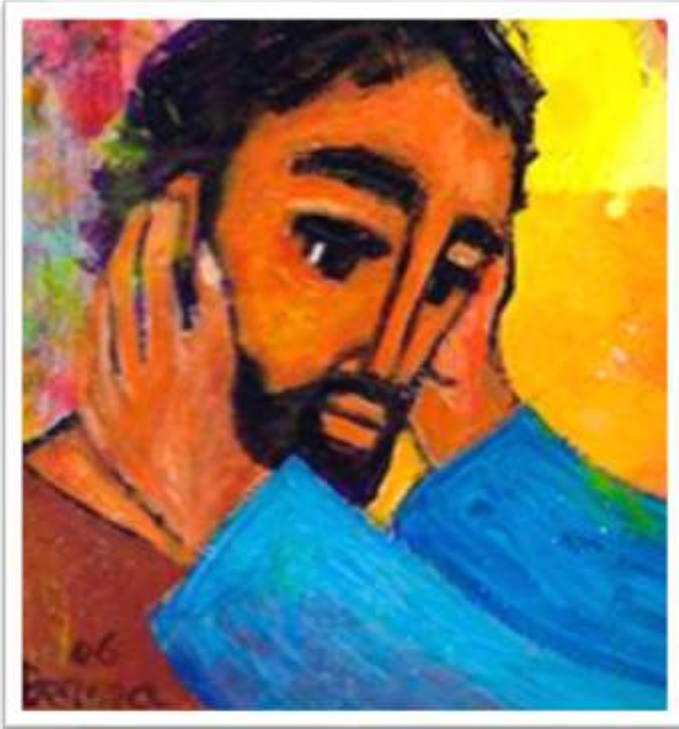

What shows us the presence of God? In the Biblical world it was miracles - signs, which pointed towards the emergence of a new Kingdom, the Kingdom of God. This had been prophesied from of old: it was said that One would come, and also that certain things would be associated with this Messiah which would display the perfection of the Kingdom God wanted to establish. Jesus, in both his preaching and his miracles, proclaims that the Kingdom of God is at hand, in his own person. He fulfils the prophecies of the past, as he displays to the people of his own time, and to us, the nature of Gods Kingdom: in it all diseases and afflictions are abolished: so opening the man's ears and eyes tells us two things: first that Jesus is God, present in our midst, and secondly that he calls us into a Kingdom where all is perfect.

# Public Health Devon Information

Exeter is now in an 'enhanced response area' because COVID-19 case rates here are so high. Cases in Devon are rising (622 per 100,000 of the population) far higher than the national average (332). Socialising appears to be the main driver. Please do your bit by:

- limiting your social contacts to stop the virus spreading, meeting others outside because that's safer than meeting inside
- continuing to wear face coverings when indoors in public places
- washing your hands properly and regularly
- testing yourself regularly with rapid lateral flow device tests
- having the COVID-19 vaccine when offered
- self-isolating and arranging a PCR test if you show any symptoms of coronavirus or you are told to by NHS Test and Trace

## Education Sunday 2021 *September 12*

Education Sunday is marked this year on 12 September – just after the new academic year starts. The theme for 2021 is ‘A word in season’, taken from Isaiah 50:4.

Churches Together in England (CTE) rightly describes teaching and studying as “demanding and privileged callings” and Education Sunday gives us the opportunity to give thanks to God for all who teach and all who study, for all who continually have to find the right words and deliver them with enthusiasm and graciousness.

This is all the more poignant as we attempt to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. Teachers, pupils and leaders in our schools have suffered 18 months of disruption and uncertainty. For the second year in a row, GCSE and A Level students have been Centre Assessed or Teacher Assessed – a challenging situation for both teachers and pupils. On 12 September, we pray that God will fortify those working to make our schools places of learning and sanctuary – not just teachers and leaders but all the support staff whose tireless work sometimes goes unnoticed. We pray for all our primary and secondary pupils – particularly school leavers who have had such a difficult journey in recent times – not to mention students in higher education and vocational training.

## Afghan Refugees: How we can help

As people arrive in the UK seeking refuge, there are lots of opportunities for people to get involved such as offering vacant properties and housing for refugees, as well as community and cultural activities, English language support and other options. Donations – specifically baby equipment, clothes and homeware – are also being welcomed in some areas.

Councils are leading on resettling families and those who want to help can search their postcode on this website, to find the specific help their council is looking for. Donations Organisations which are seeking clothing and other material support include Refugee Support Devon. The charity has collection points around the UK for donations, which are sorted according to the number and age of people in nearby

hotels. It particularly wants good quality shoes and coats for adults and children, baby buggies and baby carriers and unlocked smartphones.

The Arc Plymouth <https://www.thearcplymouth.co.uk/afghan-appeal-donations> - *Their collection is currently on hold due to the high number of donations received. Many donation points have already received more items than they can store, so please check first before taking items.*

Housing Councils are looking for self-contained flats or houses, available on an open-ended/rolling lease and with rent affordable within the Local Housing Allowance for the relevant area and size of property. They favour properties in larger towns rather than rural locations, to minimise the risk of isolation. Cash Donations. The Refugee Council has an appeal to help Afghans resettling in the UK. The British Red Cross is appealing for donations and is already supporting hundreds of people newly arrived from Afghanistan.

Community Sponsorship There may be the opportunity for community sponsorship, which allows parishes to welcome a family. Community sponsors provide housing for the refugees and support them in integrating into life in the UK. They help to arrange access to medical and social services, English language tuition and support towards employment and self-sufficiency.
