Master, let me see again

All of Jesus' miracles can be read in many different ways: there is always a message 'almost a parable' behind each one, that tells us something about God, about his care for his people, about Jesus and

about the promises God has made to us, his children. Today is no exception: on the simplest level, we see Jesus offering the greatest gift he could give to Bartimaeus - the gift of sight. It shows us Jesus' love and care for those who suffer. But that alone is not the whole meaning of this story, as the first reading makes clear: there, through Jeremiah, God promises to gather his children into a new and perfect Kingdom, washing away the tears and restoring comfort. So Jesus appears as a fulfilment of this prophecy, as the One who brings this Kingdom into the world. But it doesn't end there: in our own age we still have the blind, and those who suffer: there are still tears to be washed away Jesus' work is begun, but not completed. God's promises extend to us as well. As followers of Jesus, we should imitate him in doing what we can to bring that comfort which is the Kingdom of God to all in need.

For a Synodal Church

The launch of the Diocesan Phase of the Synodal Process. This month, Pope Francis opened a two-year Synodal Journey with three phases (diocesan, continental, universal) of consultations and discernment, culminating with an assembly in October 2023 in Rome. The overall theme is "*For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission*". Pope Francis started the Journey in Rome on 10 October. The Synodal journey is concerned with how teaching can be lived and applied in the changing contexts of our time. This journey is an opportunity to listen to each other and the Holy Spirit and to reflect on our future path. We want everyone to have an opportunity to express their views. Resources will be provided by the Diocese to parishes, schools and groups to support this listening and discernment process. Our local listening phase will take place over the coming months, starting with a Liturgy that was led by Bishop Mark at the Cathedral at 4.00pm on Sunday 17 October (this

can be accessed on the Diocese YouTube Channel). Everyone was invited to attend one of our initial introductory online events to explain the Synodal journey in more detail and how we plan to go forward in our Diocese. These were on Wednesday 20 October and Saturday 23 October These sessions will be available on our Diocesan Website [here](#)

A message from Bishop Mark

In October 2021, Pope Francis will open a three-year synodal journey with three phases of consultations and discernment, culminating with an assembly in October 2023 in Rome. The first phase of the Synodal Process will be a time of listening in local churches. Our Diocese will continue the synodal journey which started with 'A Precious Place of God's Grace'. Later in the year, working through our parishes and schools, we will be fostering as broad a consultation as possible, reaching out to integrate the voice of the poor and the excluded – walking together to explore how the Church can respond to today's challenges and engage everyone in being more Missionary. I encourage everyone in our Diocese to engage in this important process in the life of the Church, locally and universally, so that we can all be more effective missionary disciples. ***Bishop Mark O'Toole***

Appeal for Carers

An appeal for care workers has been launched by the County Council, as the shortage of care workers gets worse. Care providers are struggling to find enough staff. Many are turning down new requests for help while doing the best they can to care for vulnerable clients. In Devon, around 2,000 additional care workers are needed to fill growing numbers of vacancies, and demand for care is rising. "There are more people in Devon today who quite simply need help, than there are people to provide it," said Cllr James McInnes. "I'm talking about help with shopping, picking up prescriptions, preparing a meal, or company because they're lonely." If you have experience of caring for someone and are keen to work in the care sector, DCC want to hear from you. There's one to one support to help you, and free training. If you can be a Personal Assistant, we can help with advice and guidance. If you have time to volunteer to help people in your local community, we can help put you in touch. Silver Schools



Of such I dream, my world!



28 October St Simon, Apostle

Simon is eleventh in the list of the twelve Apostles. He is known as Simon the Zealot, but nothing else is known about him. His other name of “Simon Cananaeus” simply adapts another Hebrew word for “zeal” and has nothing to do with the town of Cana.



28 October St Jude, Apostle

Jude, also called Thaddaeus, is the apostle who at the Last Supper asked the Lord why he showed himself only to the disciples and not to the world. For many centuries he was scarcely venerated because people confused him with Judas Iscariot. He is the patron saint of lost and desperate causes.
