This hoard of yours, whose will it be?

Jesus uses the occasion as a 'teachable moment', instructing the audience on the *folly of greed and selfishness*. He contradicts the

Epicurean motto: *'Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die.'* Greed arises when our heart loves material things and possessions in selfish and disordered ways. The parable reminds us that our possessions are merely loaned to us by God and that we are accountable for their use. We must be generous in sharing our time, our treasure, our talents, and the three elements of Christian stewardship (Being faithful stewards. Diligent Earner and Prudent Spender. A Generous Giver First, a Wise Saver and Cautious Debtor).

Every one of us is rich in one thing or another. God expects us to be grateful to Him by sharing all these blessings with others for His glory. Giving God the first fruits of our labours, not the meagre leftovers, is a traditional way of becoming "rich in what matters to God." Therefore, let us control our greed which takes many forms. It diverts our life away from God, away from serving and loving other people. It directs all our energy and attention to fulfilling the self. These are all false gods that will consume us unless we become rich toward God. *Fr Anil*

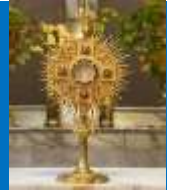

World Day Against Trafficking in Persons

Today is an annual event to raise awareness and increase prevention of people trafficking and modern-day slavery. Trafficking in persons is a serious crime and a violation of human rights. Thousands of men, women and children fall victim to traffickers every year. This often happens as a result of them being misled to believe that they are being taken to work that will make their family better off, or through force or being kidnapped. Victims lose their rights and are forced to work, often doing hard labour or prostitution, but receive no payment. Additionally, they also frequently have their documents taken from them and are threatened with punishment if they should try to escape.
