Exeter WAYmakers January Update

Exeter WAYmakers is a Community Sponsorship Group working towards welcoming a refugee family to Exeter.

The government has set up a system - Community Sponsorship - to assist with the settling of refugees in this country, allowing communities to welcome families and help with their integration when arriving here. Exeter Waymakers are a Community Sponsorship Group from Catholic Exeter including Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart and Topsham parishes. We are working towards welcoming and resettling a refugee family in Exeter with the support of the Catholic charity Caritas Plymouth. These UNHCR refugees have been waiting a long time in camps to be resettled.

Progress in the last 12 months

The parishes of Sacred Heart, Blessed Sacrament and Holy Cross have been supporting this project for over twelve months in a variety of ways. Fundraising has been progressing well: we have received a number of very generous donations and several events, such as coffee mornings and plays together with pumpkin carving at St Nicholas school, have raised money towards the fund. Some of this money will be used to purchase furniture and equipment when our family arrives together with paying for services that may be necessary, such as interpreting. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have contributed to this very worthy cause. We have raised over £15000 so far.

A major obstacle to progress has been finding suitable accommodation for a refugee family and the team has been working hard through 2022 to explore how

this can be achieved. Given the financial circumstances around benefits and the rental and purchase housing markets, this has proved a real challenge but a promising possible solution is presently being discussed.

Next steps

As mentioned above, we need help now on the core team within areas such as communication - website, social media.

When the family arrives we will also need volunteers to help with a variety of jobs - welcoming and supporting the family with attending appointments, befriending, transport around the city, translating and many others, such as help with the benefits system and even DIY skills!

St Petrock's. Supporting the homeless

You are warmly invited to St Petrock's annual Homelessness Sunday Service on Sunday 29 January at 4.00pm (doors open 3.45pm). This is a simple annual event we host each year to bring together supporters to reflect on homelessness together, with readings, Christian teaching, songs and a space to remember those from the homeless community who have died.

The service will be in St Petrock's Church (entry via the High Street – next door to Caffè Nero) followed by refreshments afterwards in St Petrock's Centre.

Rev Andy Mulcock from Isca Church and Rev Ross Maynard from South St Baptist will be leading this year's service, with music from St Basil's.

Mary's Meals

Every serving of Mary's meals now costs 10p and the cost of feeding a child for a school year has risen from £15.90 to £19.15.

This is the first increase to this figure since March 2020. The soaring prices of essential commodities – such as grain, fuel and fertiliser – mean that the cost of feeding children with Mary's Meals has risen by 20%.

We know that the escalating cost of living is causing much pain for both people here in the UK who make our work possible and the children who eat Mary's Meals. If you can give any amount today, please know that this will be received

with deep gratitude – particularly because our income is not growing at the same rate as the cost of feeding the children

Our [Double The Love](#) campaign ends on 31 January. Until then, donations to Mary's Meals will be matched by a group of generous supporters, up to £1.5 million. This means that any donation, no matter the size, will have twice the impact! Thank you for everything you do for Mary's Meals.
