
# CATHOLIC EXETER

He says to them, 'I have come to complete the Law and the Prophets', not 'I have received a way to follow them'. Jesus is claiming not to be just some enlightened teacher, or a great prophet, but God himself. We are free to ignore or embrace his commandments, but in doing so we are either ignoring or embracing the kingdom of heaven. We cannot pick and choose.
