

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

On Palm Sunday the long reading of the Passion dominates the celebration, and in a sense its meaning is obvious. Do not allow this, however, to detract from the other readings, which give the vital context necessary for understanding the Passion as more than just a long story. It is our story, the tale of how God achieved OUR salvation by the supreme sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Celebrating Holy Week

The drama of Holy Week, from Palm Sunday, through Good Friday, and culminating on Easter Sunday, contains a great mystery of which we are all a part. This mystery is summed up by St Paul in his letter to the Philippians. 'Christ Jesus emptied himself and became as all men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name above all other names.' As we journey through these pivotal events in human history remember that you are there in the middle of it all. It is *your* feet that Jesus washes; it is *you* that he offers himself through bread and wine; it is *your* suffering, weakness, and sin that he carries; it is *your* death that he endures *for you* and *with you*. And finally, it is his Resurrection and Life that is offered *to you*! For God so loved *you*, that he gave his only Son, that if you believe in him you will not perish but have eternal life! 
