In the parable of the unmerciful servant, we are all familiar with the message that if we do not forgive others from our heart then we cannot access God's forgiveness of us. Yet, in the parable the most striking thing is the proportion of forgiveness between what the servant owes the master and what he himself is owed by another. One talent was a weight of gold or silver worth fifteen years' pay for

a labourer. The servant owed his master ten thousand talents, that's 150,000 years pay! To pay it off, that's how long he would have to work, which is impossible! However, one denarius is worth only one day's pay. So, the servant was himself owed only 100 days labour. 150,000 years vs. 100 days. The debt he was owed pales in comparison to the debt he himself owed. 150,000 years' worth had been forgiven him, but he refused to forgive only 100 days. Whatever debts we think others owe us; it is nothing compared to the debt we all owe God. Yet, if we forgive, then we can access God's forgiveness. This is the mathematics of God's mercy: If you forgive 100 denarii, you will be forgiven 10,000 talents. If you do not forgive just 100 denarii, you will not be forgiven the 10,000 talents you owe. So, forgive, and you will be forgiven.

Today is Evangelii Gaudium Sunday

Evangelii Gaudium – Preparing for the Jubilee Year in Faith and Prayer.

Today we are called to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. 'Evangelii Gaudium' is Latin for 'Joy of the Gospel'. The day supports the work carried out by the Mission Directorate on behalf of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales.

A key focus of work for the next few years is responding to Pope Francis' calling of a Jubilee Year in 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. The Holy Father has invited the whole Church to prepare for the Jubilee in the two years prior through:

- Reflecting on the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council in 2023.
- Deepening our prayer life, with a special focus on the Lord's Prayer, in 2024.

To support the Church in this important initiative the Mission Directorate has produced a series of videos on the four Constitutions which reflect on the Liturgy, the Word of God, the Church and on its role in the modern world: [more info here.](#)

CAFOD News

It has been very upsetting to see the news this week about the earthquake in Morocco and the terrible floods in Libya. We hope everyone will [join us in praying](#) for the communities affected and for the helpers responding to these disasters.

How are CAFOD responding in Libya?

Storm Daniel hit Libya on 10 September, triggering devastating tsunami-like floods. Two dams burst, submerging the port city of Derna. It's feared many thousands have died, with many more missing. CAFOD doesn't have an established programme in Libya and the collapse of state structures there makes it very difficult for aid agencies to operate, but because of the scale of the disaster we will be working with a trusted partner to ensure that help can get to where it is most needed. We have launched a [Libya Floods Appeal](#) so that donations can be made to help those affected directly. We will also be relying on the prayers of the Catholic community of England and Wales as our partner works through the unique challenges of delivering help following this crisis.

How are CAFOD responding in Morocco?

It is now estimated that more than 2,800 people have been killed by the earthquake, which struck the High Atlas Mountains, south of Marrakech on Friday. Many roads are blocked by collapsed buildings which is making the rescue effort very difficult. The Moroccan government have not appealed for international aid, but we have been able to send a grant of £30,000 to a local Church partner, Caritas Rabat, to enable them to adapt their usual work and support the families affected by the earthquake. Your steadfast support and that of the whole Catholic Community of England and Wales during previous emergencies and Fast Days is what has enabled us to quickly make this grant to support work in Morocco, and to find a way to help communities devastated by the flooding in Libya. Thank you.

This coming Fast Day, we'll be sharing Meera's story, whose home in Pakistan was swept away by floods last year. With extreme disasters like these happening more and more, your love and support is needed now more than ever.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees 24 September

The Church has been celebrating World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) since 1914. It's always an occasion to express concern for different

vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them as they face many challenges; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

The theme of Pope Francis' message for the 109th World Day is: **Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay**. The theme, and indeed the Holy Father's message, echoes many of the principles found in the Bishops' document on refugees and migrants published earlier in 2023 – [Love the Stranger](#). [Read the Pope's message](#). The Vatican has a dedicated section for [Migrants and Refugees](#). It is directed personally by Pope Francis and aims to help the Church, and others, to accompany those forced to flee and make sure they are not shut out or left behind.

The Beatification of a Polish Catholic family

The beatification of a family who were murdered in March 1944 for aiding Jews, took place on Sunday 10 September in Markowa, where they lived. Ahead of the beatification, Pope Francis upheld the Ulma family's collective witness of faith in giving their lives to protect persecuted Jews during World War II: *"May the sacrifice made by the family of Józef and Wiktoria Ulma and their children, who did not hesitate to give their lives to help eight people of Jewish origin, be for us and future generations a symbol of faithfulness to values that must never be betrayed even under threat of death."* Pope Francis.

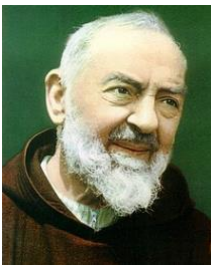

St Pius of Pietrelcina, Padre Pio

He was born in the small village of Pietrelcina in southern Italy, and joined the Capuchin friars at the age of 16. He became a priest seven years later and spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was very much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor and intercessor. Many miracles were popularly ascribed to him during his lifetime. He died a few days after the fiftieth anniversary of his receiving the stigmata, and over 100,000 people attended his funeral. *St Pio, pray for us.*
