
Gift of Remembered Love


Pope Francis - Laudate Deum

Pope Francis has issued a new Apostolic Exhortation, Laudate Deum on the climate crisis. The Pope says that "It is not enough to think only of balances of power but also the need to provide a response to new problems and to react with global mechanisms to the environmental, public health, cultural and social challenges, especially in order to consolidate respect for the most elementary human rights, social rights and the protection of our common home. It is a matter of establishing global and effective rules that can permit "providing for" this global safeguarding." (Laudate Deum 42)

CAFOD News

We have some good news about our Fix the Food System campaign!

After thousands of CAFOD supporters wrote to both the UK government and the World Bank to show we are standing up for the rights of small farmers to freely use, save and share their seeds, they have started to listen.

Over 70,000 parishioners from 762 parishes have signed in solidarity a letter written by Salina, a small farmer from Bangladesh calling on the World Bank to protect farmers' seed rights.

We have just got back from the World Bank's annual meeting in Morocco where we delivered the letters directly into the hands of the Director on Global Food Practice. Watch the video

And our campaign is working! Following our latest actions, the World Bank agreed to meet with CAFOD representatives in both London and Morocco and have started to look at the issue.

This is an important step forward in this campaign. But we know that big businesses will continue lobbying the World Bank to try to put profits before access to food. Next year we will continue to strengthen international solidarity and build on what we've achieved this year.

Online self-help (accessible anytime of the day or night)

Live <u>text-based therapy</u> (scheduled with a Clinician between 6.00am – 11.00pm, 7days a week).

You do not need a referral from a GP to access TALKWORKS' services, however you do need to be registered to a GP surgery in Devon. You can refer ourself online or over the phone. St Winefride

(Winifride, Winfred)

November 3

Very little is known about her except that she lived in the 6th or 7th century near Treffynon (Holywell) in Clwyd in Wales. Various miraculous stories are told about her, and her cult has been widespread since the Middle Ages. Its main centres were Shrewsbury, where her remains were enshrined in 1138, and the well at Holywell that sprang up where, according to one version of her life, she was beheaded and then restored to life by her uncle, St Beuno. The well has remained a place of healing and pilgrimage through the Reformation to the present day.
