Watch early for wisdom!

In this Sunday's parable, the ten bridesmaids are an image of the Church as she waits for the coming of the Lord. Whilst all ten bring lamps to greet the bridegroom, only five also bring flasks of oil as well. The foolish bridesmaids display negligent self-confidence, whilst the wise bridesmaids rely not on what they have in the lamp, but store up oil to ensure the lamp will remain lit. The lamp can be seen as an image of the human heart, and the flask of oil as the fruits of grace. Foolish Christians rely on themselves, presuming that they have hearts ready to greet the Lord. Wise Christians, on the other hand, do not rely on themselves, instead they put their confidence in the power of God's grace, that they may have a heart that seeks the Lord. A foolish Christian says, "I'm a good person" and so shuts their heart from saving grace, since they do not need it. A wise Christian says, "Lord, I am not worthy, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." For it is only by acknowledging our constant need for Jesus that our hearts burn with his love, that they are able to light the world we live in, that they are made ready to greet him when he comes. *Fr Albert*
