Today's Gospel has these simple words from Jesus, and then the story of his calling more disciples to follow him and share in the work of spreading this message.

Repentance has had something of a bad press. We tend to think of it as an oldfashioned concept. But every age needs to hear this call: to look at what we do and say and assume, and realise that there are such things as right and wrong, and that sometimes we follow the wrong path. To follow Jesus, and to accept the Kingdom of God, demands that we make a radical choice, which might well change our lives. *Salford Office for Liturgy.*

Ordination of Bishop Christopher Whitehead

Our Bishop-elect Christipher Whitehead will be ordained as tenth Bishop of Plymouth on February 22 in Plymouth Cathedral at 12.00 noon.

As much as we would wish for all who desire to take part in the Mass to be present in the Cathedral we deeply regret that its seating capacity is extremely limited.

In an effort to allocate seats fairly, each parish in the diocese will be given two tickets so that all our parishes will be represented.

At Blessed Sacrament we propose to allocate our tickets by ballot. If you would like to attend the ordination in person, please complete a ballot slip, (which can be obtained from the church porch) with your name and telephone number. Please put the completed slips through the presbytery letterbox. We will then draw out the names of the two people who are successful and let them know by phone. (Please get your ballot papers in before 30 January)

There will be opportunities to meet the Bishop personally during the coming year, when he will be visiting all areas of our diocese.

The Service of Solemn Vespers at the Cathedral on 21 February, the evening before the Ordination and Installation Mass, will be open to all wishing to come and pray with and for the Bishop-elect as he prepares for the following day's profoundly significant ceremonies for him and for our diocese.

Importantly, both the Solemn Vespers and the Ordination Mass and Installation will be live-streamed <u>here</u>, so this too may provide an opportunity for your parish community to gather together to watch the live-streamed events and to participate from afar, sharing in this historic occasion together.


