
# PARISH NEWS



## BLESSED SACRAMENT PARISH, HEAVITREE, EXETER 17 March 2024. Fifth Sunday of Lent. Year B. Psalter 1



In the weeks of Lent so far we have followed God's work of salvation: we have seen the Covenants he established with Noah, Abraham, Moses and the people of Israel after the return from Babylon. Now we come to one of the most significant parts of the Old Testament: the promise of a brand new Covenant, which will be different from all those that went before. This Covenant will see God and Man living more closely together. For the ratification of a Covenant, something was always sacrificed as a sign of the new relationship – normally man would offer some animal offering to God. But the New Covenant will be ratified not with the death of sheep or bull, but by the death of Jesus Christ, God and Man. In this perfect sacrifice is the source of our eternal salvation. In recent years, a number of independent experts have documented the serious problems in the UK's detention centres and now the Council of Europe have released its report into indefinite detention and have recommended ending its use. 
## Catholic Women's League AGM /Annual Review
