

We arrive at the fiftieth day - the completion of the Easter Season, and the completion of the Paschal Mystery: the Lord has died, is risen, has ascended to heaven and now gives birth to his Church, by sending the Spirit upon the apostles. This feast of the gift of the Spirit is so significant for us, because it marks the handing on of Jesus' ministry to the Church - in the Church we are guaranteed the presence of the Lord, in his sacraments, in his ministers, in the Blessed Sacrament and in his Celebrated Word. It also marks the fulfilment of our thoughts about baptism throughout this season: the gift of the Spirit which we receive in Confirmation is the `seal' of our baptism, guaranteeing and confirming all that baptism achieves. *Salford Office for Liturgy*



Blessed Sacrament Music Collective

Praising God through music and song is an ancient tradition. David wrote his psalms as musical poetry of worship. In the Church, praising God in song is part of this tradition. St Augustine said: 'He who sings prays twice'. We want Blessed Sacrament to be a parish where music and song are central to our liturgy at all Masses.

While there are a number of us involved in this ministry, we need more singers and musicians so that we can provide music at all the Sunday Masses more regularly. This would also help when people are poorly or on holiday. So, do you enjoy singing? Do you play an instrument?

There are no entry requirements except a desire to serve God and our parish by using your gifts. If you play the piano or keyboard, don't worry that there is only one keyboard in a group! There are now three of us that share the keyboard at different times. We need more! Guitars are on a rota as space is limited. There is a maximum of 3 at any Mass; but we need more if we are to meet our goal of music at each Sunday Mass!

We aim to play a range of music from traditional hymns of the Church to modern worship music. We are currently exploring a digital music platform so that we can play from iPads in the future. We have had two very successful BS Collective music 'jams' since November. These are a chance to learn new music and get to know one another. The next 'jams' are:

Sudan Crisis Appeal When violence broke out last year in Sudan between government and paramilitaries, most aid agencies evacuated. Now, humanitarian workers are struggling to get back into Sudan to help, meaning severe delays in getting aid to the people, and the challenges of getting into areas where fighting is still going on remain. Many borders are shut as the government say they need to keep weapons out.

The situation has gone from serious to desperate very quickly. The UN is calling it 'the world's worst displacement crisis'. At least 8 million people have had to flee their homes: famine looms. But the Church and our local partners are still there. Please, stand with them today.

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11 They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.

Psalm Response: Send forth Your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:16-25 If you are led by the Spirit no law can touch you.

Gospel John 15:26-27, 16:12-15 The Spirit of truth will lead you to the complete truth.

Sunday 26 May – The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40 The Lord is God indeed: he and no other. Psalm Response: Happy the people the Lord has chosen as his own. Second Reading: Romans 8: 14-17 You received the spirit of sons, and it makes them cry out, "Abba, Father!"

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20 Baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.



Pentecost

Painted in 1732 by the French artist Jean Restout, this image depicts the dramatic outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room. Mary is at the centre of the image, affirming her position at the heart of the Church. The Apostles are in poses showing the awe and wonder with which the Holy Spirit was received. May the Holy Spirit be poured out upon each of us this day. Happy Feast!
