BLESSED SACRAMENT PARISH, HEAVITREE, EXETER 15 September 2024. Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Year B2. Psalter 4



As we follow through the Gospel of Saint Mark, we come to an important turning point this week: after the preaching, the miracles and the journey so far, Simon Peter publicly recognises Jesus as the Messiah. But there is an important point, which is brought out by the choice of first reading today: this Messiah is a king who is destined to be rejected and killed. Jesus knows this very well, and rebukes Peter when he tries to lead him on a different path. From this point on, Saint Mark's Gospel leads to the cross: Jesus himself accepts his own cross and reminds all his followers that the cross is a part of following him. If we are considering the question "Who is Jesus?", these scripture passages give us a deep insight into the mission of salvation that he accepts for us. *Diocese of Salford Office for Liturgy*

We have a Bishop!

A message from our Diocesan Administrator Canon Paul Cummins:

I am really pleased to let you know that today Bishop Philip Moger has been announced as the Bishop-elect of the Diocese of Plymouth. Bishop Philip was a priest of the Diocese of Leeds for over 40 years, and for the last two years has served as the Auxiliary Bishop of Southwark Archdiocese. I know you will join me in extending a warm welcome to Bishop Philip as he begins his new ministry as chief pastor in our Diocese. Bishop-elect Philip will be installed as the 10th Bishop of Plymouth on 9 November at the Cathedral Church of St Mary and St Boniface, Plymouth. Further details of this celebration will be provided in time. I would like to personally thank you for all your help and support during my time as Diocesan Administrator. I will continue in this role, working alongside the Bishop-elect, until his installation in November. God bless you. Canon Paul.

And from the Bulletin of the Holy See:

The Holy Father has appointed Bishop Philip Moger, until now titular of Glastonia and auxiliary of the archdiocese of Southwark, as bishop of Plymouth, England.

Curriculum vitae

Bishop Philip Moger was born on 25 April 1955 in Halifax, in the county of West Yorkshire, diocese of Leeds, England. After attending Saint Cuthbert's College in Ushaw, he was ordained a priest on 26 June 1982 for the same diocese.

He has held the following offices: parish vicar of Saint Urban Catholic Church, Leeds (1982-1985), vicar administrator at the Middlyton Lodge Youth Centre, Ilkley (1985-1992), vicar administrator of Saint Anne's Cathedral, Leeds (1992-2001), director of vocations (1995-2004), special secretary to the bishop (2001-2004), parish priest of the *First Martyrs of Rome*, Bradford (2004-2008), dean of Saint Anne's Cathedral, Leeds (2008-2019), parish priest of the *Mother of Unfailing Help* parish, Leeds (2010-2019), parish priest of the *Saint John Mary Vianney* parish (2019-2020), rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, Walsingham (2020-2022).

He was appointed titular bishop of Glastonia and auxiliary of Southwark on 28 November 2022, and received episcopal consecration the following 21 February.

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday A Call to Mission in England and Wales

In 2013, the first year of his pontificate, Pope Francis released an Apostolic Exhortation on the joy of the Gospel titled *Evangelii Gaudium*. In it, he encouraged the Christian faithful to "embark on a new chapter of evangelisation" marked by this joy, whilst striving to find new paths to proclaim the Gospel in today's world.

We cannot forget that evangelisation is first and foremost about preaching the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus Christ or who have always rejected him. Many of these are quietly seeking God, led by a yearning to see his face... Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone. *EG14*

This is the challenge and opportunity we take up on **Evangelii Gaudium Sunday**. Formerly known as Home Mission Sunday, *Evangelii Gaudium Sunday* is celebrated each year on the Third Sunday in September.

A second collection will be taken at all Masses this weekend to support the work of the Bishop's Conference Mission Directorate.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

The 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is celebrated on **Sunday 29 September**. Pope Francis' <u>message</u> invites us to 'see in the migrants of our time, as in those of every age, a living image of God's people on their way to the eternal homeland'. For this reason, the encounter with the migrant, as with every brother and sister in need, "is also an encounter with Christ". As Christians we are called to welcome the stranger and look for opportunities to welcome those are migrants, refugees or seeking asylum in our local communities.

Caritas Diocese of Plymouth will be holding an event in Exeter at Sacred Heart Parish rooms on **Thursday 26 September** from 6-8pm which will explore how we can create a culture of welcome. What we do: Keep alive the vision of the parish and encourage and support its implementation.

The team has met several times this year to discuss how we can bring our Parish Vision into Action. We've been considering 5 main areas of parish life: Worship, Evangelisation, Community, Ministry and Discipleship.

These have been identified as being particularly relevant for parish renewal, moving from a community principally concerned with Maintenance to one which is focused on Mission.

The team met on Wednesday evening and

discussed priorities for the future. Three things emerged: House groups, The Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) and Parish Website & Welcome pack/booklet.

House Groups Living as a faithful Catholic Christian in today's world is increasingly challenging. We all need support to grow in faith and to be more confident disciples of the Lord. Praying with others, sharing our faith and supporting each other when we face challenges are all important. We already have several small groups of parishioners, and others, who meet regularly to do just this. We would like to offer more opportunities for others to meet and we will be looking at ways in which this could become a reality.

The SVP We already have an SVP group within the parish. A small group of dedicated parishioners support those in our community, and beyond, who need help and friendship. The membership of the group is getting older and needs to be bolstered by new faces. In other parishes there are also Youth SVP groups. We would like to promote the work of the SVP, get others involved and consider inviting our young people to offer themselves for this ministry.

Website and Welcome We have a <u>fantastic parish website</u>. It's informative, friendly and welcoming, but it's a challenge to keep it up to date and relevant. It's often how people are introduced to the community, so we want it to reflect who we are and what we do.
