



Parish Pilgrims – Living the Mission Together

Do you want to grow in your faith?

Do you want to get to know new people?

Do you have friends or family who are not practicing Catholics?

Do you want your faith to be more than just coming to Mass on Sunday?

At Blessed Sacrament Parish, as part of our Vision to be known and loved, we are establishing groups which we are calling Parish Pilgrims. The groups will begin small (6-8 people). The hope is that they will grow through invitation and encouragement. Once they reach a certain number of people, new groups will be formed.

Nourished by the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist and encouraged by the fellowship of the members of the group, they will support our growth and development as Catholic Christians as we strive to live as 'Missionary Disciples'; people with faith who are confident in sharing that faith with others.

How often will the groups meet? Once a fortnight.

How long will the meetings last? 90 minutes.

What will happen? Prayer, Faith-sharing, Conversation, Friendship.

Where will the meetings be? In people's homes.

Vocations Sunday

Next Sunday 11 May is the annual day of prayer for Vocations. We are all called, as St John Henry Newman reminds us, 'to some definite service' in the Church. It is part of our baptismal dignity, and we pray that God will reveal to us what it is he wants us to do for him and for one another.

On this day we pray especially for vocation to the priesthood and the religious life. We are blessed that we currently have several men in formation for priesthood for the Diocese of Plymouth; three of whom are at Allen Hall seminary, and one is in a propaedeutic year (pre-seminary) in Valladolid in Spain. We also have one man who will be making an application this summer.

The likely cost of training these five men to serve in our diocese will be £150,000 a year. Are you able to offer something to help fund their training? If so, please take a leaflet as you leave church. Envelopes are available if you are able to GiftAid your contribution. With gratitude in anticipation for your generosity. Please continue to pray for Juan, Sam, Julian, Hugo and Andrius, that the Lord will strengthen their vocation and accompany them with his Holy Spirit.

Following the success of our two previous CCSP Ascension Day fundraisers, last year at St Mary's in Poole and the previous year at Buckfast Abbey, this year's 'Rise to Our Cause' event is being held at St Cuthbert Mayne in Launceston on Thursday, 29 May 2025. St Cuthbert Mayne Church in Launceston is a sacred site of pilgrimage for the Jubilee Year, and pilgrims can get their pilgrim passport stamped, and venerate the relic of Cuthbert Mayne.

PRAYER & LITURGY

St Richard Reynolds

Richard is thought to have come from Pinhoe in Exeter and was a Bridgettine monk of Syon Abbey on the banks of the river Thames. He suffered martyrdom at Tyburn on 4 May 1535 for refusing to take the oath of royal supremacy under Henry VIII.

He was known for his personal holiness and was one of the forty martyrs canonised by Pope Paul VI in 1970. Syon Abbey, one of the great medieval monasteries, was dissolved by Henry in 1539. The expelled community moved from place to place in France and Spain, finally settling in Lisbon in 1594. This same community then moved from Lisbon to England in 1861, settling first at Spetisbury, Dorset, then in Chudleigh, and finally in 1925 in South Brent where they remained until the closure of Syon Abbey in 2011.

The stone pillar, which stands in the Martyrs Chapel of Blessed Sacrament Church was part of the gatehouse of the original Syon Abbey. The community took it with them wherever they travelled before donating it to our parish for safe keeping.
