the run up to the anniversary of 'Populorum Progressio'. The 'livesimply' principles of living simply, sustainably and in solidarity were drawn up by a group of theologians, for CAFOD.

The movement built on Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical Laudate Si' 'on Care for our Common Home' which reminds us that Creation is an expression of God's love, and encourages us to recognise that all our actions, however small, have an impact on each other and on our environment. Our 'ecological conversion' leads us to a new lifestyle of living simply, sustainably, and in solidarity with those in poverty.

As a parish, we officially received our livesimply award from CAFOD in 2019 having set out on the journey in 2017. To achieve this, we took actions to care for our common home and global family.

In this spirit, you may have noticed the patches of unmown grass at the back of the church. We wanted to give nature a helping hand by encouraging pollinating insects, connecting us with nature and giving it the best start to summer.

If you have a garden you may like to leave a corner (the larger the better) undisturbed for insects, birds, amphibians and small mammals. Even the smallest wild patch can provide vital food needed by bees and butterflies. It's a bit late for No Mow May, but why not make it Let it Bloom June? Every little helps.

## Reading the Final Synod Document Together - the School for Synodality's Online Book Club

After four weeks of listening, discerning and writing in October 2024, the final day of the Rome Synod Assembly brought a dramatic surprise from Pope Francis - that the recommendations of the Assembly would become Church teaching. The three-year listening process was over, and it was now time to get on with implementing it. The <a href="Final Synod Document">Final Synod Document</a> (officially 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission') is our guide to the implementation, and while beautiful and inspiring, can be rather technical in places.

To enable us to reflect on the document in more depth, the School for Synodality has organised an online book club with a stellar cast of experts. Each week we will unpack a different section of the Final Synod Document, reflecting on its theological and practical implications, with time for questions afterwards.

#### Day for Life 15 June 2025

Every year, the Church in England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland, jointly marks the Day for Life, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year, it will be celebrated on Trinity Sunday, the 15<sup>th</sup> of June. The faithful are invited to join in prayer and promotion of the Day. Useful resources, including a message from the three bishops, and prayers, can be found on the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales' website.

On the 15<sup>th</sup> of June we will also hold a second collection for the Day for Life Fund. Every year, the fund allocates over £200,000 in grants, to organisations that which promote the Christian respect for life from conception to natural death, in various ways. This has made a significant impact in local communities of England and Wales, by for example, providing mothers and children with necessary means. This is possible if it was not for your generous support to the fund, we therefore invite you to give as much as you can and encourage others to do so.
