

This is a very difficult set of readings. The Gospel itself starts with a saying which many find hard to understand: must we really "hate" our family to be the Lord's disciple? The point is that it is relative: what are we prepared to give up for the Gospel? Are we going to try and make our own cross, or accept whatever we are given? Jesus is probably trying to discourage the crowd of sensation seekers and hangers-on who are crowing round him. He wants real disciples, who are aware of the possible cost: not like the incompetent builder, or the useless king. To be a disciple, one must be prepared to follow Jesus anywhere, whatever it might cost in possessions, family or friends. We may never understand why, but then "Who can know the intentions of God?"

Important Message: Nationwide Emergency Alert Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3.00pm

The UK Government will sound the next Nationwide Emergency alert on Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3.00pm. This alert is designed to protect the public. However, for victims of domestic abuse, especially those living with a hidden or second mobile device, it can unintentionally put them at serious risk.

NOTE: The alert, which triggers a loud, unavoidable siren and message on all compatible mobile phones, will sound even if a phone is on silent. For more information please follow this link.

For individuals currently managing their safety discreetly, especially those in coercive or controlling environments, this could expose a secret device or raise questions that could jeopardise their wellbeing.

Important Safeguards to Take NOW

Disable alerts on any hidden device (Settings > Notifications > Advanced Settings > Emergency Alerts). Please note this varies by device / operating system. Detailed instructions from the gov.uk website to "opt out" of the alerts: can be found at this link. Consider turning off or powering down any secondary phone before the test. ACTION: Please circulate this information to anyone you believe may be at risk.

The CSSA would now like to invite *anyone* involved in the Diocese of Plymouth, be that clergy, curia, parishioner, volunteer or any other connection to complete a similar survey, collating feedback around perceptions and understanding of survivor support in the Diocese.

While the primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, the CSSA do not wish to limit what people choose to share.

Forming in Faith

The Church's recent Synod on Synodality has culminated in a document that summarises the Church's findings.

After four weeks of listening, discerning and writing in October 2024, the final day of the Rome Synod Assembly brought a dramatic surprise from Pope Francis - that the recommendations of the Assembly would become Church teaching. The three-year listening process was over, and it was now time to get on with implementing it.

Over the next 6 sessions, the School of Synodality will unpack a different section of the Final Synod Document, reflecting on its theological and practical implications, through recorded interviews with experts.

Come along to deepen your understanding of what synodality is and how it is a universal call for all of us to listen to each other and engage in conversation with the Spirit. The first session is entitled 'The Heart of Synodality'.
