Sunday 25 January marks World Leprosy Day, which aims to raise awareness of a disease that many people think no longer exists. Each year 200,000 people are diagnosed with leprosy and there are millions more who are living with the damaging consequences of delayed leprosy treatment because of the stigma that still surrounds the disease.

St Francis Leprosy Guild (SFLG) which is the UK's only Catholic leprosy charity has been caring for people with leprosy for 130 years. 
# Dilexi Te – The Burning Heart of the Church’s Mission

## Towards a synodal church – Conversations in the Spirit



How do we listen to each other well?

How do we step back from our own agendas to be attentive to where the Spirit is moving? How can we make better decisions

about organising ourselves as Christian communities? How do we enrich our parish communal life with enriching conversations? The Synod process has emphasised the importance of listening and good conversations in our community life. However, these are not always so easy in practice!

Blessed Sacrament Exeter are hosting a one day face-to-face facilitator training workshop with Fr Matthew Nunes, Director of the School for Synodality.

This Conversations in the Spirit workshop will run on Saturday 21 February and will introduce the principles of holding prayerful, truthful and safe conversations which

value gracious listening and courageous speaking. It is suitable for all levels of experience, including people who have not been involved in the Synod process so far. Dear friends, this year your small group of SVP volunteers has again been busy on your behalf. Here are some of our highlights.

We offered befriending and practical support to 22 individuals and families within the wider Exeter community. We did this through face to face visits at home, care homes or in hospital, providing transport and company well attending hospital appointments.

We continue to welcome, support, nourish and befriend anyone off the street who walks into our weekly Outreach Chatter Café . Over the months and years these individuals have begun to see the Café as more than just somewhere for a cuppa and a slice of cake, but rather somewhere to form friendships and share stories.

Thanks to your generosity, this year we have been able to offer support to 14 young families in difficulty over Christmas, as well as funding our school shoes project which continues to help children at St Nicholas School.

We have already delivered 50 Vinnie Packs for Exeter's homeless community. We continue to fund bus tickets to enable 20 migrant mothers living in the airport hotel,

to reach the Heavitree cultural kitchen at the Parklife centre, where they are able to prepare meals for their families.

We have purchased furniture and warm clothing for some families. Throughout this year we have continued to network and collaborate with other agencies within Exeter who care for our vulnerable and deprived communities.

In collaboration with other SVP Conferences in the Diocese, we have been able to support three small start up projects in our twinned parishes in India.
